and weeds from their right of way during the month of June each year. An act providing for the granting of water power franchise by the state, and collecting fees therefor.

An act providing for an appropriation to extend the state Portage Road from Big Eddy to The Dalles, thereby completing the connection between the boat lines of the upper and lower Columbia River.

An Act compelling railroad companies to install cattle guards. An act protecting the purchasers of stocks and bonds, and preventing fraud in the sale thereof, commonly known as the "Blue Sky Law". An act amending section 6904 of Lord's Oregon Laws, relative to demurrage and re-

ciprocal demurrage, and preventing discrimination. An act providing for the surrendering and turning over to the State of Oregon by the Southern Pacific Company certain property at the foot of Jefferson street, commonly known as the "Public Levee".

An act providing for the supervision and regulation of the issuance of stock certifiof public corporations.
