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**Three Tools For a Small Garden**  
In a small garden (20 by 50 feet, 1000 square feet, or smaller, where the work is all done by man power rather than by horse power, the only tools required are a digging fork or spade, a steel-tooth rake, and a hoe. If the spading is done by hired help the laborer probably has his own spade or digging fork and thus the gardener needs only a hoe and a rake.

Two stakes and a string as long as the rows are to be made will serve the purpose of a purchased garden line to lay off straight rows. The end of the rake handle or hoe handle may be used to mark out the row along the tightly stretched string. The blade of the hoe may also be used for marking out the row.

## TEN THOUSAND SKILLED MEN WANTED FOR SERVICE

### In Aviation Section Signal Corps

Qualified men registered under the selective-service law may be inducted into service to fill the call for 10,000 skilled mechanics needed by the Aviation Section of the Signal Corps, by applying to their local boards. Men not registered may enlist at recruiting stations.

The present call is particularly for machinists, auto mechanics, engine repairmen, gunsmiths, chauffeurs, carpenters, blacksmiths, tinsmiths, cabinet-makers, electricians, coppermiths, sheetmetal workers, propeller makers, wireless operators and constructors, tailors, tentmakers, sailmakers, truck masters, vulcanizers, welders, and experts on magnetos, ignition systems, cameras, watches, and clocks.

Men will be sent to San Antonio, Tex., for segregation by trades, followed by a brief course of instruction at flying fields or factories, then organized into squadrons mostly for service overseas. Additional information may be secured by application to the Air Division, Personnel Department, Washington, D. C.
