IN MEMORY OF GEORGE H. MEYER, KILLED IN ACTION

The following poem was written by Mrs. H. W. Bangs in memory of her brother, George H. Meyer, company D, 361st infantry, 91st division, who was wounded in the Argonne October 4, 1918, and died three days later in an American Red Cross hospital at Fleury, 18 miles from the scene of the battle:

We are always thinking of our dear one,
In his far-off, unknown grave,
Who fought for his flag and country
And died a soldier brave.
But the hardest part is now to come,
While the heroes all return,
And we miss among the smiling throng
The face of our own dear one.

Somewhere in France on the long battle line,

DEMAND FOR FARM LABOR EXCEEDS PRESENT SUPPLY

The weekly bulletin issued by the U. S. Employment Service, 75 Third street, states that the demand for farm help still exceeds the supply that is available at this time. There are several calls this week for milkers at wages ranging from \$75 to \$100 per month, with room and board for experienced men. In about 10 hayings in the Willamette valley will be in full swing with wages ranging from \$3 to \$5 per day.

There is still a demand for help in the shipyards, especially for unskilled men. There is no general demand for skilled mechanics. Orders are on file with the U. S. Employment service for 200 men to work in mills and woods, the wage rate for common laborers being \$4, and that for hooktenders, high climbers and a few others going as high as \$8 per day.

Work for boys is plentiful. Last week 44 boys were placed in positions paying on an average of \$50 per month. Boys seeking employment must be more than 16 years old or must secure a permit to work before registering.

The women's division of the U. S. Employment Service has openings this week for 2000 women and girls in the strawberry fields. The price established for pickers is 11 to 13 cents per carrier of six boxes.

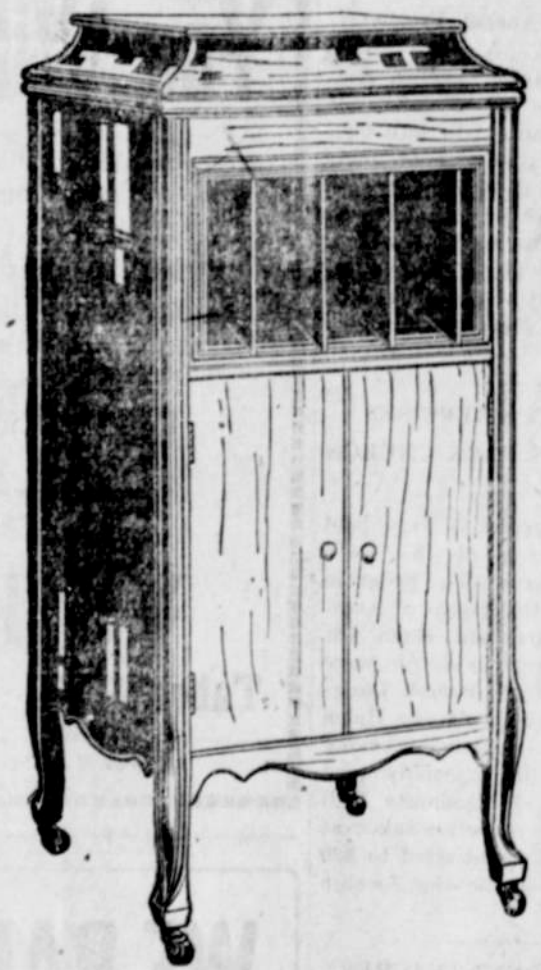
