On Wednesday evening, the 22nd, the Arleta Women of Woodcraft held a regular ceremonial meeting, followed by a social hour and refreshments.

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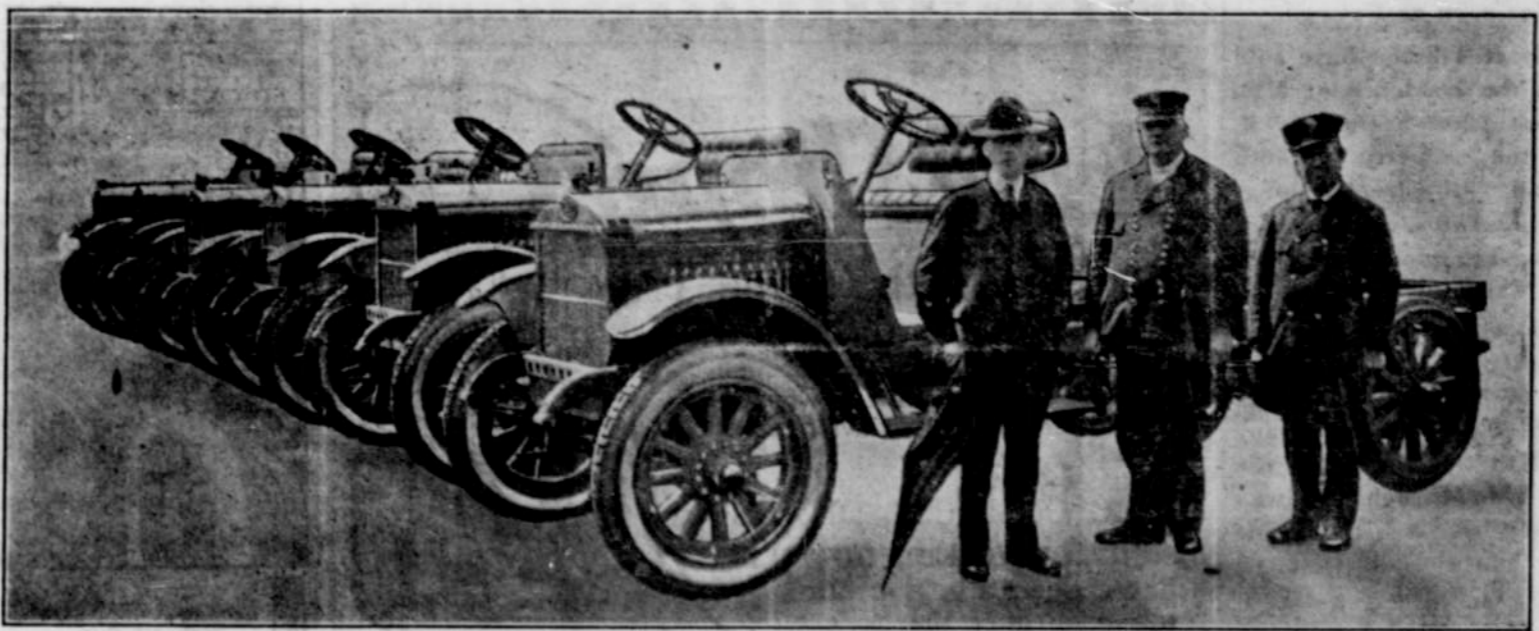
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
