Have You Read These Books?

Alaska Days with John Muir—by S. Hall Young. This is not only a breezy out-door book, full of the wild beauties of the Alaskan wilderness, but it is also a living portrait of John Muir in the great moments of his life.

A Treasury of War Poetry, volumes 1 and 2. Here is a permanent record in verse of the experiences and deep feeling aroused by the war. Volume 1 contains poems written during the first half of the war, and volume 2 includes poems inspired by the signing of the armistice.

"Ma Pettengill," by Harry Leon Wilson. Ma Pettengill is as clean-cut a personality as Puddin'head Wilson, though quite different. To know her is an experience to be remembered with pleasure for life.

"With Those Who Wait," by Frances Huard. Back of the lines, fighting as truly as the sons of France were the women, and the children, and the dumb animals. This book is the story of their service as seen by Frances Huard.

"Man Four-square," by William Raine. Those who like western stories in which there is something doing every minute will find this tale very much to their taste.

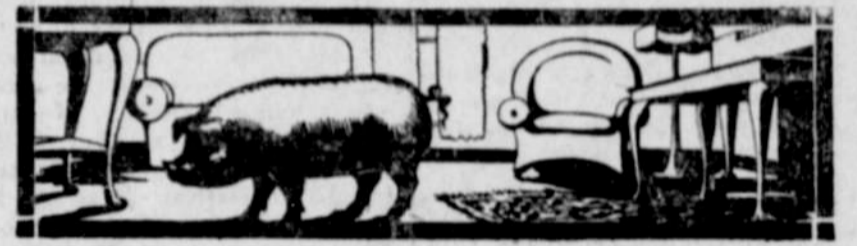
