

"Kist of Whistles."

The first organ ever used in a Scotch Preshyterian church was built by the famous inventor, James Watt. It was a small chamber affair set up for his own use. Upon going to Birmingham to live he left it behind him in Glasgow. There it came into the possession of the minister of St. Andrew's church. For some time the organ was used for weekday choir practice only. On a Sunday in August, 1807. however, an organist of the Episcopalian faith earned that denomination the name of the "whistling kirk." The shocked presbytery declared the use of the "kist of whistles" contrary to the kirk law, and it was ignominiously cast out after a single service. Not until 1860 was the organ tolerated in St. Andrew's. The ancient instrument ejected by the Presbytery of St. Andrew's is said to be still in existence in the house of a Scottish squire near Biggar.
