A WALKLESS ARTERY

An unknown autoist knocked down and seriously injured a Lents young woman at 85th and Foster Road Sunday night. The autoist continued on his careening way. That driver is not a human being, he is a cowardly brute.

Last year, the Herald is informed, within 400 feet of the same place a man was knocked down by the same kind of a driver, rendered unconscious and left by the side of the road, later to die.

There are several lessons to be drawn from these two, of the many, many unnecessary automobile accidents in Portland.

The first is: an increasingly strict surveillance of automobiles and their drivers.

The second: severe jail penalties at least for accidents in which the inhumanity of the driver is shown.

The third: greater care on the part of pedestrians. Jay-walking, playing on the streets or roads, stopping in the middle of the street for conversation,—these things should be forbidden under pain of legal penalty.

The fourth, which applies to this district along the Foster Road particularly, but also to any other section, is: until the city of Portland sees to it that a sidewalk of some kind is placed along Foster Road, pedestrians should realize that walking upon the highway, with machines running rapidly in either direction, is the making of a rendezvous with accident or death.

The Herald feels that while there is a pavement on Foster Road, and nothing but a trail for the most part along either side, pedestrians will walk on the road, peril or no peril. No penalty will or can keep them off. The present advantage of a more level, cleaner walk will outweigh the danger of the highway in the pedestrians' minds, indeed if the pedestrian even thinks of the peril of the highway.

Lents citizens should demand that some kind of a sidewalk be placed upon the side or at least one side of such highways as Foster Road. For how many blocks of cement sidewalk are worth a human life?
