BURDETTE WRITES A LETTER

Dear Jim: My February cream test, by chemists of the City of Portland, was 5 per cent (3 1/2 per cent is required by law). My bacteria count was 1300 (10,000 is allowed in certified milk and I do not even have to keep within 10,000 for I haven't had that test made—I surpassed it so far I didn't need to). My solids tested 9.7 (8 1/2 is required).
