#### Yard Wide.

One cup sugar, one-half cup molasses, spoonfull lard, one-half teaspoon salt, one-fourth teaspoon ginger, one rounding teaspoon soda, cream all together, add one cup sour milk and flour enough to roll in shape. Cut in strips and bake the same as cookies.

#### Brownies.

To one cup sugar add two well-beaten eggs, one cup milk, a little salt, cassia and flour enough to make a stiff dough. Drop by spoonfulls into deep hot fat. They will need to fry about five minutes. Roll in sugar or not as desired.

#### Yankee Notions.

Line muffin tins with good pastry (pie crust dough is best) put in each one teaspoon of some kind of jelly or preserve and on top of that a spoonfull of cake batter. Bake in moderate oven.

#### Popcorn Pudding.

One cup of ground popcorn, one pint milk, one-half cup sugar, pinch salt, one egg, flavoring. Bake three-fourths hour.

#### Hulled Corn.

Take three or five quarts of yellow field corn, put in a large kettle full or nearly full of water, and five or six large teaspoons soda, cook till corn swells and hulls come off easily. Wash and rinse in several waters, then when hulls are about all off and taken out, put back in kettle, after first washing kettle, and continue cooking, changing water three or four times till done, salt the last water. This is much better than using lye and will not injure the stomach.

#### Jelly Roll.

Beat three eggs thoroughly, add one cup sugar, three tablespoons milk, one cup flour, two teaspoons baking powder, one teaspoon salt, one teaspoon vanilla. Pour into large, shallow pan and bake. Turn onto a sugared cloth, spread with jelly and roll at once.

#### Monkey Faces.

One-half cup butter, one cup sugar, one cup molasses, one cup of cold water, two eggs beaten, two teaspoons soda, one teaspoon of cinnamon, one of cloves, five cups of flour; mix in order given, drop from spoon into tins and use raisins on top to form the eyes and nose; bake in quick oven.

#### Creamed Potatoes and Cheese.

Melt one and one-half tablespoons of butter and one tablespoonfull of flour and gradually 1/2 cup of milk. Stir until thickened, then add one and one-half cups cold boiled potatoes cut in cubes. When seasoned with salt and pepper, add one-third cup of grated cheese. Reheat and serve hot.

#### Peanut Soup.

Soak a pint of peanut meats over night in two quarts of water; in the morning add three quarts of water, a bay leaf, stalk of celery and one onion, boil slowly for four hours; rub through a sieve and return to the fire; when heated again add one spoon of butter and one cup of cream or milk. Serve hot.

When you over salt the soup, tomatoes or any food, place a cloth over the top of the kettle and let it remain on the stove. The cloth will draw out the salt.

#### Parker House Rolls.

Boil one pint milk, melt into tablespoon of butter and two tablespoons of white sugar. When the milk becomes only warm stir in with a knife one-half compressed yeast cake dissolved in one-half cup warm water, a little salt and flour enough to make a thick batter, though not very stiff; let it rise over night and in the morning add flour enough to knead it; do this until very smooth, and let it stand until middle of the day, then make into rolls, cutting with an oval cutter, turning over one-half with a bit of butter. Let rise. Bake in quick oven.
