

family. Oatmeal Bread, -Boll enough potatoes to make two cupfuls when mashed and save

the water in

which they were cooked, adding enough water to make one quart. Pour this over the potatoes, add two tablespoonfuls of shortening, one tablespoonful of sugar and oats; let boil five minutes then remove and cool.
