Interesting Facts About Clatsop County Chapter, American Red Cross

The Clatsop County Chapter Secretary of the Red Cross, during the year from October 1, 1921, to October 1, 1922, visited 1490 families. She talked with 2175 persons in the office. "A total of 1881 letter was received and written. The average day's work was: Five home visits, seven office interviews, seven letters written and received, and five home calls.

Visits were made to 23 communities in the county. Persons in 24 diferent states were communicated with. It was necessary to get in touch with persons in Alaska, Germany, Norway and Turkey. All this was done in connection with aid given local tamilies and individuals.

The Red Cross could not function were it not for the co-operation of other organizations. The Clatsop County Chapter has found the following agencies very helpful, both in Clatsop county and all over the United States:
