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JOHNSON STIRRING OREGON AUDIENCES WITH HIS ORATORY

**KU KLUX KLANNER SPEAKS
TO FULL HOUSE LAST EVE**
Gave a Rapid-Fire Lecture for Over
Two Hours at Courthouse.

BILLY SUNDAY'S ONLY RIVAL
J. R. Johnson, Portland Cyclops, Tears
Into Things: Asks for an
Understanding.

J. R. Johnson, Exalted Cyclops of the
Portland Klan, Knights of the Ku Klux
spoke at the courthouse last night to
a house filled with rather an enthusias-
tic people. We mention the fact that
they were enthusiastic because they
were—they cheered and clapped often
and the laughs were hearty also.

Mr. Johnson, we gather, has been
a preacher in the Christian Church.
He reminded us of a preacher in his
style at first, and later by his work.

For a rapid-fire talker, we have
heard but one man his superior—Billy
Sunday. He has fewer adjectives than
Billy, but he was otherwise much like
him. Leave out the slang and vul-
garity of Sunday and J. R. Johnson
is him.

His opening plea was for the Bible.
He spoke of the Protestant Bible and
what it meant to the people where it
has been accepted and where its pre-
cepts have been followed. He declared
that Protestants were wandering away
from the solid teachings of the Master
and that evidence of this was shown
in the youth of the land, in the dis-
solving homes, in the divorce courts
and in the criminal courts.

Refers to Bible.
He compared the Bible and Chris-
tianity with the Mohammedan follow-
ers and asked who would change places
with Turks. He mentioned the yellow
men and asked who would trade Chris-
tianity for what the Japs have or what
the Chinese have.

He mentioned the Philippines and
Cuba and Mexico where the Catholic
Bible has been taught for centuries
and compared conditions with those
where the Protestant Bible has been
taught.

"He took occasion to mention the
school bill that was passed in Oregon
this last election and mentioned the
\$100,000 slush fund that is being raised
by the K. C.'s to have it declared un-
constitutional.

He said it was not the Protestants
who were interfering with religious
liberty and asserted that there was
nothing in the school bill concerning
religion. He then mentioned the fact
that religious freedom was taken
away from Catholic children before
they were born and went further and
declared that this freedom was taken
away before they were conceived. As
a proof he mentioned the fact that
before a Protestant can be permitted
to marry a Catholic in the church the
Protestant must sign away his rights
to raise any children in the Protestant
faith, or in other words, the Protestant
must agree to allow the Catholics to
direct the spiritual welfare of the chil-
dren.

He mentioned the activities of the
K. K. K.'s in Portland and he gave a
number of instances where the Klan
had taken steps to curb activities that
were not for the best interests of the
people of that city. He did not men-
tion the names of anyone who had
been tarred or feathered and he said
that was not the way the Klan worked
in Portland.

In his pre-appearance notices he was
billed to compare the principles of the
American government with those of
the K. K. K.

Among other things he said he
thought he would be safe in saying
that because of the drifting away
from the teachings of the Bible, 25
per cent of men of this country are
thinking more of some other man's
wife than they were of their own.
Right there the women in the audi-
ence all cheered.

Then he made the same statement
about the women thinking more about
some other woman's husband, and the
men all cheered.

He mentioned the excitement he had
created at Albany while there and de-
clared that Mr. Lane who ran some
advertising against him, but who is



really Priest Lane, had not answered
a single argument he had made nor
disputed a single statement.
He was going strong when we were
forced to leave because of lack of time
and the audience was clamoring for
more.

SINN FEINERS HERE AFTER MORE MONEY

**Jail Is the Place for Them
Until They Can Be
Deported**

Sinn Fein grafters from Ireland are
in Portland trying to raise money
"to relieve distress" in their Pope-
ridden country. Every man or wo-
man who tries to break the entente
cordiale now fortunately existing be-
tween Great Britain and the United
States ought to be put in jail without
ceremony and deported on the first
boat leaving their port of entry. The
New York Tribune states the facts in
the comment given below:

"That Admiral Sims in his over-
blazing candor hit somewhere near
the truth in his attack on the Sinn
Fein politicians of America is plain
from the outcries that are heard. It
was time for someone to say out loud
that Sinn Fein hyphenism is un-Amer-
ican and that weak-kneed politicians
do themselves no credit when they
cater to it.

"America protested, and properly
protested, when an element in Eng-
land helped this nation's enemies in
our Civil War. It is just as objec-
tionable now for an element in this
country to foment civil war in an-
other nation and to furnish funds to
support murder gangs which hit in
the dark and are subjecting Ireland
to the horrors of guerrilla warfare.
It is plain that fear of loss of possible
votes has colored the attitude of our
American politicians. Why deny it?
For Daniel Cohalan and others like
him suddenly to profess great con-
cern about propriety and to pretend
to be shocked by an indiscretion is
sheer hypocrisy.

"When Admiral Sims was in charge
of the American naval station at
Queenstown his men had unfortunate
experiences with Sinn Feinism. It
was necessary to forbid American sail-
ors going to Cork. He thus had first-
hand knowledge on which side in the
World War were the Sinn Feiners—
knew why they were enraged at Amer-
ica. So the Admiral may be pardoned
for not having complete patience with
Sinn Fein Americans.

"It is scarcely necessary to point
out that in condemning Sinn Fein as
it is practiced Admiral Sims did not
attack the great body of men of Irish
descent in this country. These are
Americans first and may point with
pride to a record of unbroken loyalty.
But the professional Sinn Feiner is of
another quality and cares so little for
America that he would embroil us
even to the extent of bringing on
war, in a complicated controversy
which, as President Harding has de-
clared, does not concern us."

"Friends, it is unpatriotic and un-
American to damage America be-
cause you love another country, but
there is one thing worse, and that is
to damage America because you hate
another country. The Sinn Feiner
who acts against America because
he hates England is a worse creature
than the member of the German-
American Alliance who has acted
against America because he loves
Germany. I want to point out this
bit of etymological information: Sinn
Fein means 'Us, ourselves.' It means
those who adopt that name are fight-
ing for themselves, for a certain di-
vision of people across the sea. Their
very name shows that they are not
American; that they are anti-Amer-
ican; that they are for themselves
against America."
