Archbishop Christie Joins Scott's War Declaration Against Oregonians.

PREPARING FOR STRUGGLE

Calling on Papal Lawyers to Volunteer Their Services in Litigation.

The Catholic Sentinel, official organ of Archbishop Christie, carrying its absurd motto of "One True Church," etc., still is gloating over the archiepiscopal speech delivered by "Sir" Joe Scott in Portland before a crowd of Romans on Washington's Birthday.

Mum on Joe's Anarchy. The Sentinel was mum concerning what Joe said about the modus operandi. It failed to quote what he actually said—that the people of Oregon "could not build jails large enough and OFTEN enough" to hold the valiant soldiers of the Pope—the K. C.'s, when the tug of war comes, nor did the Sentinel quote his declaration that the Catholics were determined to flout and defy the school law; that the proper way to test the

constitutionality of a law is to resist and refuse to obey it.

President of Joe's Talk.

Nevertheless, the Sentinel expressed great pride in what Joe said—all of it—and told how Archbishop Christie was the guest of honor on the archiepiscopal occasion; that Frank J. Lomagan, supreme director of the K. C., presided, and that John R. Murphy, grand knight of the Portland council, delivered the address of welcome. Archbishop Christie, says the Sentinel, also spoke, declaring war on the school law, hoping it would be declared void by the courts, and that it never would have been countenanced by the Revolutionary forefathers who fought with Washington.

KLAN MAY BATTLE FOR RIGHT TICKET IN 1924 CAMPAIGN

Whip Hand in Coming Political Struggle Held by Progressive Republicans.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 12.—Anti-Ku Klux Klan politicians seem determined to label the Klan as an issue in the coming presidential campaign, and it is going to prove exceedingly embarrassing for some people.

Your correspondent has found no Klansmen, especially those in the higher governmental positions, who is prone to avoid the issue. They do not seem willing themselves to bring it up, but if the other side wants to make it an issue they certainly will find a fight, if that is what they are looking for.

Solid South is Pivotal. It practically is a foregone conclusion that the Democratic party will not endorse the Klan in its campaign, owing to its vast Catholic affiliations. The "Solid South" long the bulwark of the Democratic party, knows nothing of the Catholic inclinations of the Democrats of the north, other than hearsay, but it is a well-known fact that the big eastern and northern leaders of the party are Catholics and most of them Knights of Columbus of the fourth degree. Take, for instance, United States Senator David I. Walsh, of Massachusetts, who is chairman of the senatorial campaign committee of the Democratic party. He is the author of numerous anti-Ku Klux Klan bills which died in the sixty-seventh Congress.

Another is Charles F. Murphy, the Tammany Hall element of the party in New York City. Tammany Hall is nothing more nor less than Roman Catholic political headquarters, disguised in the Democratic party. For years they have held sway in the United States and principally through the solidarity of the south. This being the case, it would seem the Republicans have a glorious opportunity to label the Klan movement and perpetuate itself in office, for there is no doubt that the Solid South would break under the strain of bearing the Roman Catholic onus, if the issue were brought into the open. Many of the older Democratic voters, the regular old rock-ribbed type who came through the reconstruction period, would remain steadfast to the party standard, but the younger generation just coming on, those who fought through the World War and have but little of the sectional feeling left, would bolt at the first sign of Catholicism and anti-Ku Kluxism that shows in the Democratic ranks. If, on the other hand, both parties decide to excommunicate the Klan and say so openly and defiantly, the progressive element of the Republican party, which is not so tightly wedded to the G. O. P., may see fit to bolt and call a convention of its own and ride into power through Klan favor. It is a known fact that the pro-

gressive element favors the Klan and its principles. At present, the progressives are tractable and are willing to be led by the old guard leaders, provided the old guard leaders lead in the right direction, but at the first sign of their going up the wrong road something will fall on the necks of Lodge, Harding, et al.

La Follette is an able leader and a respected one. He has tolerance for the Klan, although he is not a Klansman. He is, however, a Mason and so far as is known always has lived true to Masonic ideals.

This much is true: Klansmen in Congress, many of whom are among the best known and most powerful figures in American politics, both in the Democratic and Republican parties, think alike on this question. They are willing to leave the Klan out as an issue in the 1924 campaign. But if it does come up, they will meet it, forcefully and with battle, and they are ready to uphold Klankraft against any and all comers and the party which shows the best signs is the one that is going to garner the Klan element.

GREAT UNIVERSITY TO HAVE BIG KLAN DESPITE HANDICAP

College Editor Declares Students Are Determined to Organize.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 12.—There will be a Klan at George Washington University, whether the president of the institution wants it or not, according to C. Melville Walker, editor of The Hatchet, a college paper, of last year. Mr. Walker is known to be in close touch with the students of the university.

The row was precipitated just as the honor system among the students was about to be launched. An anonymous letter saying the Ku Klux Klan was about to organize in the university reached one of the leaders of the movement and saying the Klan was seeking to control the honor system in order that it might rout the Catholics and Jews in the university.

The matter then was taken to President Hodgkins, who ruled that no Klan unit should be organized there, and which ruling was followed by the statement of Mr. Walker, who said that in his opinion, edict or no edict by the president, there would be a unit of the Klan there. Mr. Walker denies he is a Klansman.

The entire attack on the Klan bears all the old familiar earmarks of the Klan. First of all, there was the anonymous production of an anonymous "Klan" communication, which flayed the Jews and Catholics and laid bare details "which would rid the university of some obnoxious Jews and Catholics. The "Klan" letter was produced by some person who signed himself "The Crusader." It has been urged upon President Hodgkins that he is doing an unwise thing in paying any attention whatever to either of these anonymous communications.
