The only thing worth while in this world is friendship-good-fellowship-kindness and helpfulness. Money is without value, except as it may promote these blessings.

THREE CHEERS FOR LITTLE "LOOIE"!

Louis Seibold, special writer, of New York, whose name indicates his racial affiliation (Uh-huh!), has been writing up Oregon, the School Bill, the Masons and the Klan in recent issues of newspapers that buy such kikish stuff. We read the clipping from the Minneapolis Journal, which a friend was kind enough to supply.
