Ham Johnstone, a notorious Portland lawyer and former probationary Klansman, banished for treason in the violation of the Sacred Obligation which he had assumed, again has hung out his shingle and is all set to practice law. This news has caused much adverse comment, for Johnstone is believed to be unfit for the profession, thought certainly no worse than many others

Johnstone has been practically of in effect disbarred for about two years, after he was alleged to have been caught looting a citent in an estate matter, in which he was assoclated as attorney with two or three other lawyers. The grievance committee of the Bar Association investigated the case and demanded that the prosecutor prefer charges against Johnstone. The accusation never was filed, however, because the accused lawyer obeyed with alacrity the grievance committee's demand for his resignation. He failed to file this resignation with the County Court, however, and the proceedings never were filed in the Supreme Court.
