

## RELIGIOUS MUMMERY A FINE COMPARISON

Who Says Klan Is Fantastic,  
Grotesque, Outlandish  
and Sacreligious?

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 5.—  
"Thou shalt have no other gods be-  
fore me."

One of the local newspapers carries  
the following story:

"A relic of Blessed Teresa, 'the little  
flower,' whose declared intercessory  
powers resulted in her beatification  
at the Vatican on April 29 has been  
received by the Rev. Paschasius Heriz,  
superior of the Carmelite Fathers at  
Catholic university, and was solemnly  
exposed for veneration at the Mt.  
Carmel National Retreat House, 200  
T. street, northeast.

The relic consists of a piece of  
bone taken from the hand of the young  
Carmelite nun at the time of her beau-  
tification and it is the first direct  
relic of Teresa to be received in this  
country.

"With the exposition of the sacred  
relic there was begun a novena in  
Teresa's honor. Until the close of  
the novena on June 30, the relic will  
be exposed for veneration each even-  
ing. It has been encased in a reli-  
quary of gold and jewels for exposi-  
tion.

"During the novena, the Franciscan  
Sisters of the Atonement, in charge  
of the retreat house, have offered to

include in the devotion special prayers  
for any who may request remem-  
brance."

These are the same people who call  
the Ku-Klux Klan outlandish, gro-  
tesque, sacreligious and fantastic.

## LITTLE CHINKLETS HANDICAP TO CUPID

cal department of the Northwestern  
University, was sent here to be an  
intern in a hospital. While here he  
fell in love with an American nurse  
at the hospital and inveigled her into  
a promise to wed him.

He then informed his father, a rich  
rice and tea merchant in China, who  
took the matter up through diplomatic  
channels to prevent the impending  
wedding, especially in view of the fact  
that Thomas had a wife and a couple  
of little chinklets in China.

The matter finally drifted back to  
the hospital here and Thomas was  
packed off immediately by the trustees  
of the hospital, who, in addition, re-  
fused to sign his certificate of gradua-  
tion from his period of internship.

## FORD IS A MASON BUT HE DENIES IT

self as satisfied with Ford's renuncia-  
tion of the Klan and duly entered him  
upon the rolls of his favored sons.  
Parker is believed to be grooming  
himself for the Presidency also, but it  
can be safely said he will not get any-  
where if he is depending on the New  
England vote.

is always distressing to a one-rut brain; as serious thinking leads  
to reasoning, reasoning leads to logical conclusions which are apt  
to bring understanding—the last thing which the American Peo-  
ple should permit to clutter their infantile brains.

It matters not what any political party may or may not do.  
It matters not who is President or who compose the personnel of  
the Cabinet. It matters not who our Senators and Representa-  
tives are, or what they pledge themselves to do or not to do. It  
matters not what is enacted as law, or what is stowed away in  
the pigeon-holes. It matters not whether there is government  
ownership of utilities, or any other thing or condition which can  
be named, as long as either Air, Water, Land or the exchange

Individual control of any one of the fundamentals in-

permit such private control. In other articles I have stated that

the trains and other thousands came  
by automobile. More than eight spe-  
cial trains were run. Preceding the  
ceremonial a grand barbecue was

served as a compliment to the visitors  
from the Crowley Klan.

events was a horserace program in  
which the events were ridden by  
Klansmen in full regalia. A big brass  
band was in attendance throughout  
the day—all Klansmen.
