

OFFICIAL REPORT
of the
Proceedings of the County Court.
January Term, 1901.

Be it remembered, that at a regular term of the county court of the State of Oregon, in and for the county of Curry, sitting for the transaction of county business, at the court house in the town of Gold Beach, Wednesday, the 9th day of Jan., 1901, and days following unto the end of the term, at which were present, Hon. M. Riley, Judge, F. H. Blake, and P. J. Lindberg, Commissioners; C. V. Woodruff, Clerk; James G. Walker, Sheriff.

The following proceedings were had, viz:

In the matter of the County Printing and publishing: Now at this time comes on for consideration the application of Walter Sutton, editor, publisher and proprietor of the Port Orford Tribune, a weekly newspaper published at Port Orford in the county of Curry and State of Oregon, and of general circulation in said county; and he having filed his application for said printing and publishing, and the court being fully advised in the premises; It is ordered by the court that the said Port Orford Tribune be, and the same is hereby designated as the official newspaper of the county for the year ending December 31, 1901.

In the matter of a division of School District No. 16: Now comes on for consideration the petition of 19 legal voters of school district No. 16, petitioning the court to divide said district, and M. B. Gibson, Deputy School Supt., appearing for Supt. W. S. Guerin, and the court being fully advised in the premises, It is ordered that said petition be granted, and that said district be known as Preston No. 1; that the boundaries of said district be as follows: Commencing at the southwest corner of T. 38, S. 13, E. 13; thence following said Township line due East, to SE corner; thence North to NE corner of said Township; thence due West to N. W. corner; thence due South to place of beginning.

In the matter of a change in county road between Sanders' creek and Bagwell's Ferry, in district No. 4: Now at this time comes on for consideration the petition of 18 legal voters of said district, and the court being fully advised in the premises, It is ordered that said petition be dissolved.

In the matter of the resignation of W. H. Crook, supervisor of road district No. 3: Now comes on for consideration the above matter, and the court being fully advised in the premises, It is ordered that said resignation is hereby accepted. And it is ordered that William Walker be and he is hereby appointed to fill said vacancy.

It is ordered by the court that Walter Critch's bill for giant powder purchased for constructing and repairing the county trail in Dist. No. 11, be allowed out of the 5 per cent road fund, \$5.42.

It is ordered by the court that J. Huntley and M. B. Gibson's bills for examining books of county officers be allowed, as follows: J. Huntley, \$60; M. B. Gibson, \$60.

In the matter of examining the reports of road supervisors for the year ending Dec. 31, 1900: The above matter coming on for consideration, and the court being fully advised in the premises; It is ordered that the reports of the following named supervisors for said year be and they are hereby approved.
