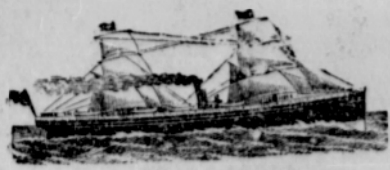

The last legislature changed the date for holding Circuit Court in this county, and it will meet this year on the fourth Monday in August, instead of the third Monday, as heretofore.

Mrs. Alice Zumwalt has leased the Laurel Inn at Dairyville. Mrs. Crew not being interested with her, as stated last week. Mrs. Zumwalt will assume the management of the hotel on the first of September.

This vicinity was visited by quite a heavy thunder storm last Tuesday evening, the rain continuing throughout the night. The weather has since been very dry, and the country is in danger of great forest fires, unless another rain comes soon.

On August 1, the State Treasurer apportioned the sum of \$165,697.96 of irreducible school funds among the several counties of the state, the apportionment being based on the school population. Of this sum, Coos county received \$4,765.32 and Curry county received \$841.80.

Mr. Hunt is still sojourning in Port Orford, hoping for a speedy termination of the San Francisco strike, so that he may ship sheep and cattle per steamer. A continuance of the strike will compel him to drive his sheep to the railroad, and he will not purchase beef cattle.

Latest news from San Francisco give little hope for an early settlement of the strike. Nearly all the coasting vessels are now tied up in the city, being unable to either load or go to sea. Every effort is being made to get outside help, but with little success. It is impossible to say when the Arcata will resume her regular trips.

It will be a trial of his luck at hunting and fishing, and he expects to prosecute the same to the full extent of the game law.

New York, Aug. 2.—A dispatch to the Journal and Advertiser from Madrid says: Lieutenant Enrique Capriles, ex Governor of Santiago de Cuba, who was on board the Spanish cruiser Viscaaya during the battle of Santiago, in an attempt to escape with the city records and treasure of Santiago, in an interview regarding Admiral Schley said: "I was on the bridge of the Viscaaya and saw the fight. I saw the Brooklyn, and from an excellent position observed the movements. The Brooklyn attacked us, and it is ridiculous to say the Brooklyn kept too far away or staid out of the fight. There cannot have been cowardice where one ship engaged three others. Eyewitnesses of the battle are dying off, and it is better to finally settle the question now, while enough witnesses are living."

According to a report from the U. S. Consul at Vancouver, B. C., labor strikes have paralyzed business in that section. He says the trackmen of the Canadian Pacific railway are on a strike and the employees of the Northport smelter, at Rossland, which has been shipping ten thousand tons of ore weekly, many of whom are American citizens are also on a strike. The latter he thinks is a very serious affair.
