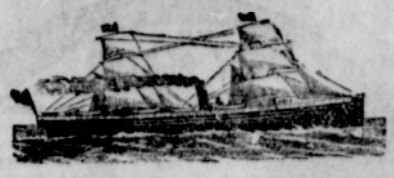

Gold Beach News.

Gold Beach, Jan. 19, 1902.

The storm clouds have rolled by and the wind is in the Northwest again.

Sheriff Walker has received the new stub books required by law and is now prepared to receive taxes for the year 1901.

County Clerk C. V. Woodruff has received the registration books, and every voter in the County should see that his name is down on the register before May 15.

Robert Paskins is building himself a new boat. The middle is entirely his own and is something between a clipper and a schooner. The boat when finished is to be named the Nine-Such.

The schooner Berwick is still bound in the river and the Dal Norte is outside waiting for the bar to smooth down.

Last Tuesday the Copper Queen came along and attempted to enter the river over the point of the South spit but found the water to shallow. She was thrown well up onto the beach by the breakers, and at low tide was high and dry. Mr. Burns, who was on board, had her cargo, consisting of thirteen and a half tons of merchandise taken out and hauled to town and has opened a store in the Strahan hotel.

The Copper Queen is but little damaged and, though still on the beach, she has been moved some distance toward the river, and as the tides are increasing she will, no doubt, soon be floated off. R. E. Guthridge has charge of the new store.

Dick's popularity and qualifications in that line are well known and appreciated in this community. He is the right man in the right place.

The Gold Bug mine, situated on Mt. Reuben, is steadily hammering away with its five-stamp mill and the ore keeps up to the high standard which has made the Gold Bug one of the foremost of Southern Oregon mines. About 20 men are now steadily employed. The company has just finished putting in a new cyanide plant which will enable them to extract greater values from the ore and the tailings will also be re-worked. The Gold Bug tailings carry assay values of about \$15 per ton, as it has been impossible with the appliances at hand to secure this portion of the values.

The tailings, however, have not been lost, but have been saved by cribbing. The mill is located on a slope and a series of dams have been constructed to hold the tailings for future operation.

A depth of 300 feet has been reached, the ore body having increased in size and richness with the depth. A new hoist will soon be added and other improvements in equipment will be made.

The Gold Bug is situated on the Whiskey creek side of Mt. Reuben, only three miles from Rogue river in a most pleasant and beautiful location. Its outlet is by wagon road to Glendale, 18 miles distant.—Grants Pass Courier.
