A law is needed in Oregon that will enable a logger to transport his logs across the lands of a neighbor on the payment of reasonable damages...

The law which provides for condemnation proceeding to take possession of private property for public use cannot be applied in the case of the logger, because a logging camp cannot be called a public enterprise...

The laws of Oregon in this respect are different from those of any other timbered state in the Union. Even Washington laws will enable a logger to get his logs across another man's land on paying of reasonable damages.

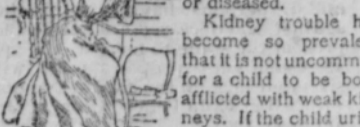
