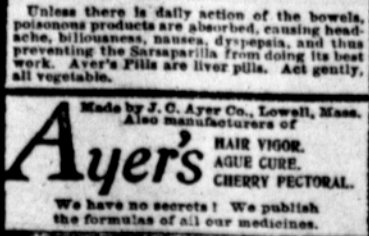
A Dilemma.

Senator Fulton promptly opens headquarters in Portland for the purpose of aiding the Taft propaganda and helping the cause of his successful rival for the senatorial nomination, Mr. Calkins. This is a step which meets with warm and general approval.

But the action of Senator Fulton has allayed whatever feeling there was, due to disappointment. It has demonstrated to his friends precisely where he stands and how thoroughly he feels the importance of the political issues at stake.

CURRENT TOPICS.

Editor TRIBUNE:—The Millionaire grafters in San Francisco as in every other great city, as the Standard Oil in Buffalo, do not hesitate to employ the bomb to accomplish their purposes and buttress their rule.

The chief witness in the prosecution of Patrick Calhoun and his co-thieves is Ex Supervisor Gallagher who resides in Oakland. Recently an attempt was made upon his life by blowing up his home which by a miracle, failed to destroy his whole family.

Suspects have been arrested, among others one who had been a strike breaker in St. Louis, and whose role it had been to blow up tracks and cars in order that the crimes be laid at the doors of the strikers.

While the multimillionaire Wm C. Whitney, politician and "Captain of Industry" was yet alive it used to be pointed out by his partisans that Whitney furnished one example of a clean handed man of great wealth.

And now since his death Whitney's business perfidy has been exposed in all its naked deformity. The expose was brought about under the operation of the new utilities law forced through N. Y. Legislature by Governor Hughes.

against Bryan were Republican millionaires, while Whitney and Ryan claimed to be Democrats. Men like Tilden and Bryan and Governor Hughes are up against the real thing in aspiring to the Presidency.

Laws to Be Voted Upon.

The voters of Oregon will have to burn midnight oil so that they can vote intelligently on the 18 measures that will be considered under the initiative and referendum by the voters at the polls in June.

Two of these bills are for the regulation of salmon fishing on the Columbia river and are in conflict. One provides that there shall be no fishing with wheels on the Columbia above the mouth of the Sandy river.

One of the most important of the measures is the bill to extend the powers of the Port of Portland and improve the Columbia river, the bar, the pilot service and the tug service. The bills passed by the legislature on which the referendum has been evoked are:

- To increase the annual appropriation for the State University to \$125,000. To require the railroads to issue passes to all state, district and county officials. To appropriate \$100,000 for National Guard armories. To give sheriffs exclusive control of county prisoners. Amendments to the constitution for which petitions have been filed or are being circulated are: To increase the number of judges of the supreme court from three to five (by the legislature). To give political parties proportionate representation in the legislature. To provide for the recall of public officials and for the election of their successors. To take from district attorneys the power of indictment and vest it in grand juries. To exempt certain property from taxation. To prevent the legislature from amending or repealing initiative laws (by the state grange.) To give each city or town the sole right to regulate its business hours, theatres and the like on Sunday. To extend suffrage to women. The corrupt practice act, limiting the amount of money candidates may expend for campaign expenses. Requiring all legislative candidates to subscribe to Statement No. One. For division of Wasco county and the creation of another county with Hood River as the county seat. Prohibiting the fishing for salmon and sturgeon in the Columbia river above the Sandy. Restricting the amount of fishing gear on the lower Columbia and providing a weekly and an annual closed season. Enlarging the powers of the Port of Portland in the interest of better navigation on the Lower Willamette and Columbia rivers.
