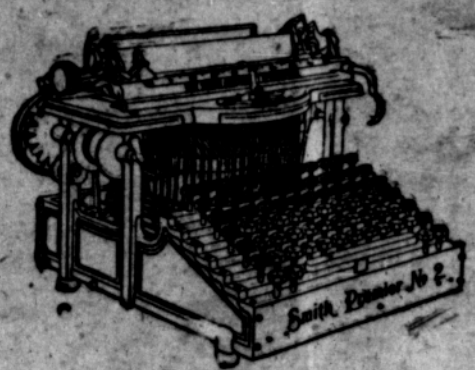

#### TALE OF ORANGE BLOSSOM

Legend of Spain Tells How It Was First Used at a Wedding in That Country.

The wearing of orange blossom at a wedding is accounted for in various ways. Among other stories is the following popular legend from Spain: An African king presented a Spanish king with a magnificent orange tree whose creamy, waxy blossoms and wonderful fragrance excited the admiration of the whole court. Many begged in vain for a branch of the plant and a foreign ambassador was forwarded to the king's native land, suggesting possible means to accomplish his purpose, but all his efforts coming to naught he gave up in despair.

The fair daughter of the court gardener was loved by a young artisan, but she lacked the dowry which the family considered necessary to a bride. One day, chance led to break off a spray of orange blossom, the gardener thought lessly gave it to his daughter. Seeing the coveted prize in the girl's hair the wily ambassador offered her a sum sufficient for the dowry, provided she gave him a branch and said nothing about it. Her marriage was soon celebrated, and on her way to the altar, the grateful remembrance of the source of all her happiness, she secretly broke off another bit of the lucky tree to adorn her hair.

Whether the poor court gardener lost his head in consequence of his daughter's treachery the legend does not relate, but many lands now know the wonderful tree, and ever since that wedding day orange blossom has been considered a fitting adornment for a bride.

#### NO REJECTED LOVERS.

Silted Sweethearts Are Unknown in the Cape Horn Race of Savages—Refusal May Mean Death.

Courtship among the Tierra del Fuego is the strange race of savages inhabiting the islands in the neighborhood of Cape Horn is a simple but serious business. Having chosen a bride, the savage wooer offers the lady his hunting bow. If she takes it and returns it at once, then the suitor understands that he is accepted. As a matter of fact, a woman rarely, if ever, rejects an offer of marriage, for a Tierra del Fuego does not take a rejection patiently, and is apt to resent a denial by wounding the damsel with an arrow.

It is, perhaps, needless to add that there are no henpecked husbands in Tierra del Fuego. The men, in fact band themselves together in a sort of society, the aim of which is to keep the women in subjection. This curious custom is the outcome of a tradition that the women once had the upper hand, and forced the men to do all the drudgery. As men in a savage state are even more prejudiced against work than their civilized brothers, it is quite natural that they should take measures accordingly.

#### Properties of Asbestos.

The terrible disaster in the Iroquois theater at Chicago has attracted universal attention to the singular substance, asbestos, which can be carded like wool and formed into fire proof cloth or paper. Asbestos belongs to the hornblende type of minerals and in some respects forms a kind of link between the vegetable and animal kingdoms. It is, says Mr. A. F. Collins, at once fibrous and crystalline, elastic and brittle, heavy as rock in the crude state, yet light as thistle-down when mechanically treated. The best asbestos for the manufacture of fire-proof cloth comes from lower Canada. It is found in narrow seams, about an inch and a quarter in thickness, sometimes vertical and sometimes horizontal in the continuing rock. As it comes from the rock it is worth \$200 a ton; but the long fibers, shipped ready for spinning and weaving, are worth \$1,500 a ton.—Youth's Companion.
