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NEW CANDIDATES.

Five new candidates announce themselves for office in this issue of the TRIBUNE. We wish them all good luck, but at least one of them will have to go down to defeat at the polls in November.

S. P. Peirce, who announces his candidacy for Joint Representative of Coos and Curry counties, has twice been elected to that position and in speaking of his record recently the Oregon Voter said the state at large owed him much for his work as a member of the Ways and Means committee. Mr. Peirce volunteered and served in the engineer corps of the Canadian army in France during the late war.

W. H. Crook, who seeks the Republican nomination as County Commissioner, is one of the big taxpayers of southern Curry. He is a practical business man who should make good as a county official, and it is quite probable he will be nominated and elected without opposition.

For re-nomination as County Assessor F. S. Moore needs no introduction to the voters of the county. He has held the office one term and has made good, and his re-election is only a matter of form.

Harry Backensto has the distinction of being the first Democrat in the county to announce himself for office. Mr. Backensto has been a resident of Gold Beach for the past 8 or 10 years, and has the qualifications to fill with credit the office of County Treasurer to which he aspires.

James D. Fay, who asks the Republican nomination as Treasurer, has been a resident of the Gold Beach section for the past several years and has a homestead at Myers creek. He is a printer by trade, which is evidence he has never handled much money, but nevertheless he believes he could safely care for the county's funds, and his qualifications to do so are good.

FOR SHAME.

It is reported that one of the big taxpayers of this vicinity paid his port tax a few days ago "under protest." If such is the case, and we have reason to believe that it is, the TRIBUNE says shame on that taxpayer.

Opinions of men differ, and the honest opinion of anyone is entitled to respect and consideration. When the Port of Port Orford was being organized, there was excuse for doubt to arise in the mind as to the probable benefit it would be to the community, but now that the organization is completed and the assurance of a wharf in our harbor is causing a big fishing industry to start, one saw mill under construction, another being enlarged, and still another definitely assured, it seems incredible that anyone living within the district would proclaim himself an obstructionist to such progress as he surely does when he pays his port tax under protest.

That this person is a big taxpayer would indicate that he has prospered in the community whose development he would strangle. Again we say, shame on such a taxpayer.

A GOOD MOVE.

In making provisions for fund for the building of the Sixes river road the county court last week decided to cut the width of the Elk river road from 12 to 10 feet. This, we believe, was a good move.

What the various communities of the county need for their development are good roads the year around, the width of which are of secondary consideration. The travel on the branch roads will never be congested, and in a hilly country like this the saving of two feet in the width of such roads will build many an additional mile.

The day is not far distant when traffic will demand width on the main highway through Curry, and it is well to commence building with that fact in view, but the court is undoubtedly establishing a wise precedent in not starting to build the feeders to this highway wider than present or future conditions will warrant.

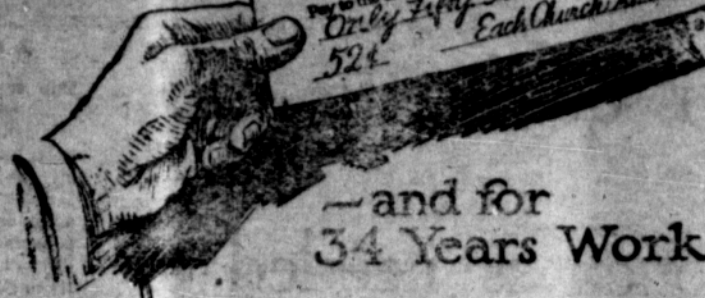
