To this end the Treasury Department is sending out Thrift stamps to all the teachers in the public schools who will take up the work. No greater service can be rendered to the boys and girls of today than to give time and effort to this important phase of school life.

Sample Thrift cards have been sent out to most of the teachers of the schools of this county. If there are any who have not received these pamphlets, I shall be glad to send them to any who will so advise me.

As an incentive to induce children to take up the work, I am offering a splendid present to the school in the county that will make the best showing on the sale of Thrift stamps for the school year 1922-23. If the teachers interested will send a Thrift Stamp report to me along with their monthly reports, I will compile the totals and publish them in the papers each month.
