Z. Taliaferro was appointed to confer with the club members as to the advisability of changing the meeting night.

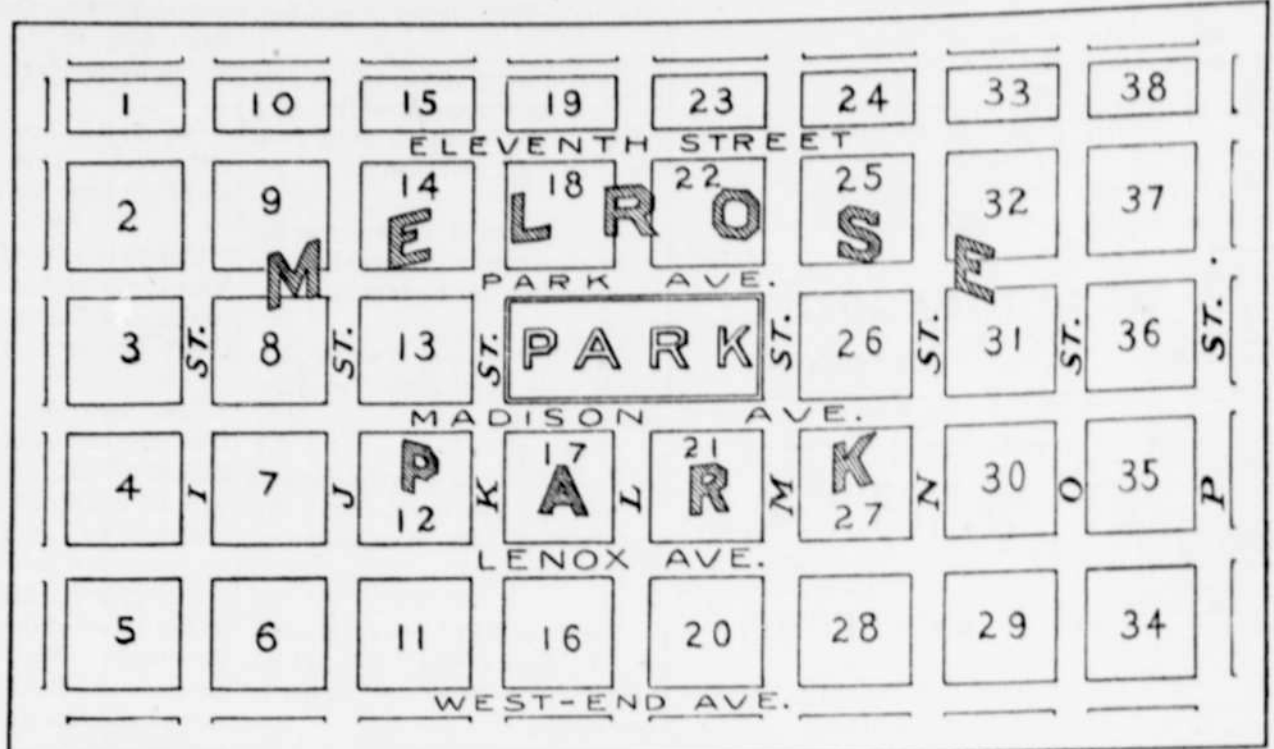
