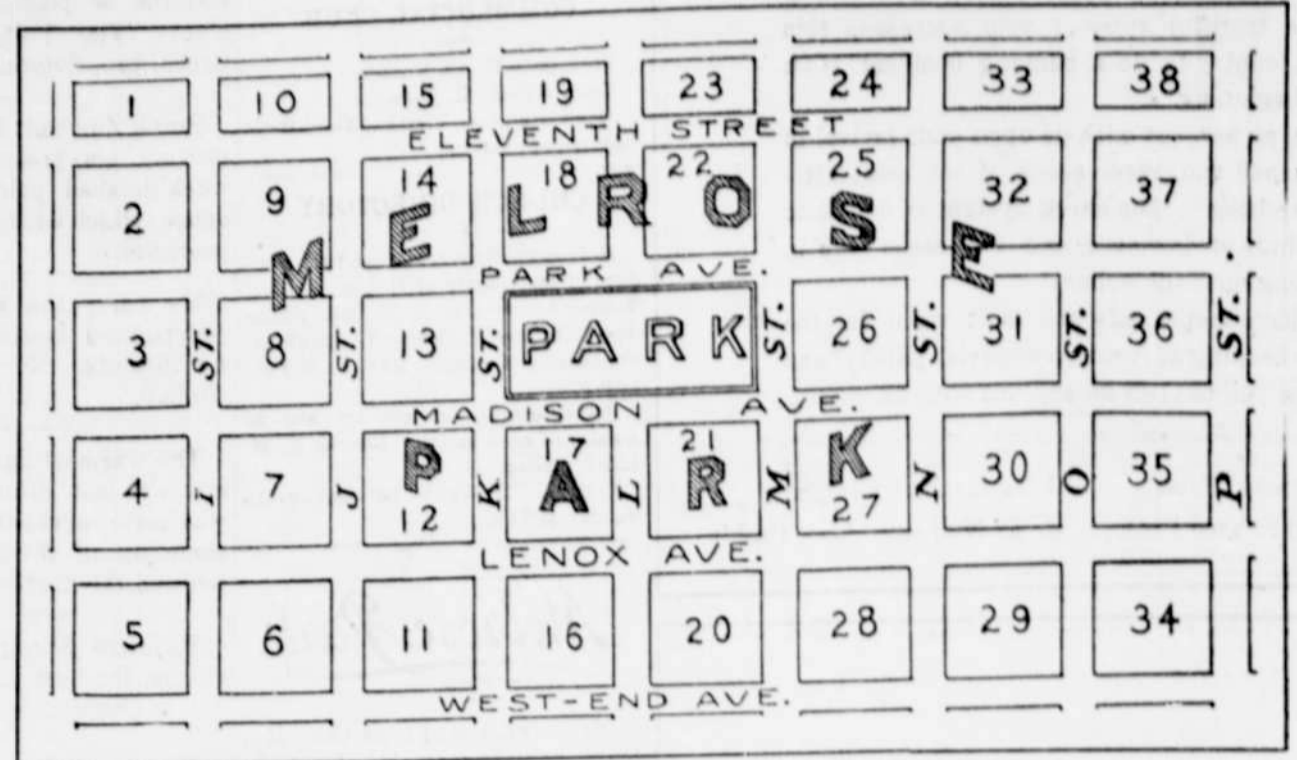
Library Meeting September 3rd
