Ordinance No. 8.

An Ordinance vacating certain lots, blocks, streets, alleys and parts of blocks in the Redmond Townsite Company's First Addition to the City of Redmond, Oregon.

Whereas, the Redmond Realty and Investment Company, a corporation, did, on the 26th day of August, 1910, present to the Common Council of the City of Redmond, Oregon, its certain petition asking that the following described lots, blocks, streets alleys and parts of blocks, be vacated, to-wit: Blocks Four (4), Five (5), Six (6), Seven (7), Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), Sixteen (16), Seventeen (17), and the alleys in said blocks; the west one-half of Block Thirteen (13), and streets No. Thirteen (13) and Fourteen (14), and all that portion of streets B. C. and D. lying and being West of the East line of Thirteenth street, all lying and being in the Redmond Townsite Company's First Addition to the City of Redmond, Oregon, and

Whereas, it appears that the said Redmond Realty and Investment Company is the sole, exclusive and only owner of all of said addition and that the rights and interests of no other person, firm or corporation is or will be affected by the granting of the prayer of said petition and the vacation of the said lots, blocks, streets, alleys and parts of blocks as therein prayed for, and

Whereas, the said company has caused notice of said application to be posted in three of the most public places in said City of Redmond, Oregon, for a period of thirty days previous hereto as appears by the notice of application now on file in the office of the City Recorder, together with the affidavit of posting endorsed on the back thereof, and

Whereas, no opposition has been made to the granting of the prayer of said petition by any person, firm or corporation, and

Whereas, the granting of the prayer of said petition and the re-platting of said addition as proposed by said company will make the said streets and alleys more serviceable to the public and the said addition more valuable to the owner, now, therefore,

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Redmond, Oregon.

Section 1. That the lots, blocks and parts of blocks, streets and alleys included in the following description, to-wit: Blocks four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7), fourteen (14), fifteen (15), sixteen (16), seventeen (17) and the alleys in said blocks; the west one-half of block thirteen (13), and streets No. Thirteen (13), and Fourteen (14), and all that portion of streets B. C. and D. lying and being west of the east line of Thirteenth street, all lying and being in the Redmond Townsite Company's First Addition to the City of Redmond, Oregon, be and the same are hereby vacated and the prior platting thereof held for naught.

Passed by the common council at a regular session thereof, held in the City of Redmond, Oregon, on the 27th day of September, 1910.

Ordinance No. 9

An ordinance relating to city officers, their election or appointment, powers, duties, qualifications and compensation.

Be it ordained by the Common

Council of the City of Redmond, Oregon.

Section 1. The common council of the city of Redmond, Oregon, shall consist of a mayor and six councilmen.

Section 2. At each regular municipal election there shall be elected three councilmen from the city at large and each of such councilmen shall hold his office for a term of two years and until his successor is elected and has qualified, provided, that at the general municipal election in December, in the year 1910, six councilmen shall be elected from the city at large, who shall, at the first meeting of the council in January, 1911, so classify themselves by lot that three of their numbers shall go out of office at the expiration of one year and three of their number at the expiration of two years.

Section 3. At each biennial election, in even numbered years, there shall be elected a mayor, recorder, marshal and treasurer, and each such officer shall hold his office for a term of two years and until his successor has been elected and has qualified.

Section 4. No person shall be elected, or appointed, to a city office who shall not be a qualified elector, under the constitution of this state, and a resident of the city for a period of six months next preceding his election or appointment.

Section 5. The regular municipal elections shall be held annually on the Tuesday after the first Monday in December in each year, and shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by the laws of this state for holding general elections; special elections may be held at the time and in the manner and under such circumstances and conditions as may be provided for by the laws of this state or by ordinance.

Section 6. The common council, at the last meeting in November, in each year, shall designate the place of voting and shall appoint three judges and three clerks of election, who must possess the qualifications of electors, who shall constitute an election board, and who shall receive the sum of \$3 each for their services at such election. In case of vacancy, at the opening of the polls, in the office of either judge or clerk, such vacancy shall be filled by the members of the board present. The judges and clerks shall take and subscribe to the oath required of judges and clerks of election under the general election law of this state.

Section 7. The city recorder shall, previous to each election, procure the necessary poll books, ballot boxes, stationery and all other things necessary to properly conduct said election and deliver the same to one of the judges of said election. He shall also secure the necessary place for holding said election and provide the necessary fuel and lights to properly heat and light the same.

Section 8. At all elections the polls shall be opened at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of election day and remain open until 7 o'clock in the evening at which time they shall be closed.

Section 9. When the poll is closed the board of election shall, without adjournment, canvass the votes and ascertain the result of said election, giving to each candidate the number of votes counted for him. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected and the judges shall issue a certificate accordingly.

Section 10. If two or more persons are found to have an equal and the highest number of votes, the election of one of them shall be determined by lot in the following manner: The name of each such candidate shall be written on separate pieces of paper, as nearly uniform in size and material as possible, and placed in a receptacle so that the names cannot be seen. Then, in the presence of the board of canvassers, one of them shall publicly draw one of such names and the person whose name is drawn shall be declared elected. The result of such drawing shall be entered upon the abstract of votes and duly recorded and a certificate of election issued to such person as provided for in the preceding section.

Section 11. Immediately after ascertaining and proclaiming the result of said election and before

separating, the judges shall fold, string and seal in an envelope all ballots accepted and not disputed. They shall also fold, string and seal in another envelope all ballots rejected or disputed. They shall then return both said envelopes, together with the poll books, to the city recorder, who shall carefully preserve the same for a period of six months and until the determination of any contest that may be then pending, after which they shall be destroyed.

Section 12. At the next meeting of the council after such election the city recorder shall publicly read the result thereof, as shown by the poll books returned by the judges of such election, and a full record thereof shall be entered at length in the minutes of such meeting.

Section 13. Any person wishing to contest the election of any person to any municipal office may give written notice thereof to the council within thirty days from the time said person shall claim to have been elected, setting forth briefly the cause of said contest. Thereupon the council shall fix the time and place for the trial of said contest and cause notice thereof to be issued by the recorder and served by the marshal on the parties to the contest. Thereupon the proceedings of the council relating thereto shall be, as nearly as practicable, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI of Title XXVIII of B. & C. Code of Oregon.

Section 14. The terms of all elective officers shall commence on the second Tuesday in January next succeeding their election and of appointive officers immediately upon their appointment and qualification.

Section 15. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in any elective office, from any cause, the council shall, by resolution duly passed by a majority vote of all the members of the council and recorded at length in the minutes of the meeting, declare such vacancy to exist, and shall immediately proceed to appoint some suitable person to fill such vacancy and the person so appointed shall fill such vacancy until the next municipal election, at which time the same shall be filled by election. Any person appointed or elected to fill a vacancy in any office must qualify in the same manner as if elected for a regular term.

Section 16. Before entering upon the duties of mayor, recorder, marshal, or treasurer, the person elected thereto must qualify therefor by filing with the proper officer his certificate of election, with his oath of office endorsed thereon and subscribed by him to the effect that he will support the constitution of the United States and of this state, and that he will, faithfully and impartially, and to the best of his ability, discharge all the duties of the office to which he has been elected, as now are or hereafter may be required by law, and shall also give and file an undertaking to the city, in such sum as the common council may require, with two or more sufficient sureties, who shall be residents of the city, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office and that he will account for and pay over according to law all moneys that may come into his hands, by virtue of his office, and deliver to his successor, or other person authorized to receive the same, all books, papers and other property pertaining to the office, which undertaking shall be approved by the council. With the undertaking the said person shall also file the affidavit of the sureties, which affidavit shall be endorsed on said undertaking, and from which affidavit it must appear that said sureties are qualified and that, taken together, they are worth double the amount of said undertaking, over all debts and liabilities and property exempt from execution, provided however, that bonds issued by such surety companies as may be authorized by law to do business in this state may be given in lieu of the above mentioned personal bond. The oath of office and bond of the mayor, marshal and treasurer shall be filed with the city recorder and that of the city recorder with the mayor.

Section 17. Each councilman shall, before entering upon the
