## THE OFFICIAL VOTE OF CO.

Light Vote Was Polled In  
All of the Different  
Co. Precincts

The poll in Crook county was unusually light, only 853 votes were cast out of 1800 registered. Of the total 205 were democrats and 648 republicans.

The total vote received by the different candidates are as follows:

Coulter 175, Elkins 327, Hodges 81, Triplett 65, Bailey 341, Roush 232, Rice 411, Young 188, Riddle (for clerk) 53, Jordan 253 (republican votes), Hyde 162, Brown 137 (republican votes), King for treasurer, 25.

The democratic totals are: Balfour 106, Edwards 99, Brown 205, Hyde 42, and Jordan 60.

The three candidates who received votes on both tickets have a grand total of Brown 342, Jordan 313, and Hyde 204. These three men will have the honor of being candidates of both parties and none of them will have opposition in the November election.
