## GOOD ROADS AMENDMENT

Amendment No. 354 Gives Counties Power to Build Good Roads

There is one amendment among the many to be voted on at the coming election that really has a great deal of merit and that is No. 354, known as the "Good Roads Amendment to the constitution."

The amendment is as follows: "No county shall create any debts or liabilities which shall singly or in the aggregate exceed the sum of five thousand dollars, except to suppress insurrection or repel invasion, or to build permanent roads within the county, but debts for permanent roads shall be incurred only on approval of a majority of those voting on the question."

The amendment grants to the people of each county the power to pledge the credit of their county for money to build permanent public roads. The question whether or not a county should pledge its credit to raise money for building any permanent road would be submitted to a vote of the people of that county and would be decided by a majority vote. The people of any county may issue bonds or warrants, or any form of obligation they desire, for such length of time and at such rate of interest as they may determine; in short, this amendment is but an additional grant of power to the people of each county to manage their own business.

There are some counties that would build roads if given the power to do so by this amendment, and since no county is affected except those that want to build roads in this way is there any reason why the people of any county should be denied this power.

### To Enlarge School Building Here

At a meeting of the directors of the Redmond school board last week the question of building four additional rooms to the present school house was considered. This year the school enrollment has nearly doubled that of last year, and additional school room is an imperative necessity.
