 DRY FARMING**

Great Northern Agricultural Expert Talks to Redmond Audience

Last Saturday afternoon at the driving park here Prof. T. Shaw, agricultural expert of the Great Northern railroad, made a talk to the large crowd gathered, on the subject of dry farming. He explained the best methods to make the soil productive so what is now considered by some to be non-productive land, would yield from twenty to thirty bushels of wheat to the acre. He said the conditions in this section for successful dry farming were ideal if the farmers would use intelligent methods. He gave his audience much valuable information, and urged owners of dry farming land to get busy and begin producing crops.
