SAYS REDMOND IS
A MARVELOUS TOWN

Eugene Men Say it is the
Busiest Little City in
Central Oregon

Eugene Register: Oscar A. and James Campbell are back from a trip to Redmond, on the lines of the Oregon Trunk and the Deschutes railroads in Crook county. They came back via the Santiam toll road and say it is not nearly so good as either the McKenzie or Military roads if a little work were done on them. Oscar thinks the county court could not spend money better

than to build a new road from Lost Creek to the summit of the Cascades, to which Crook county has already built a fine automobile road. It is only 13 miles and a few thousand dollars would build it in good shape for automobiles and it would bring all the automobile and other travel from eastern Oregon to Lane county and Eugene. Messrs. Campbell and J. F. Allan all made investments at Redmond and they are now putting up a building for the postoffice. Mr. Allan remained there and may stay some time. Oscar says the town is growing marvellously and does more business than any town of its size he ever saw. He says it is only three days' drive from Eugene.

TO VOTE BONDS FOR NEW SCHOOL BUILDING

Present School Facilities Inadequate to Accommodate Pupils

At a meeting of the Redmond School directors last week it was decided to add the 9th and 10th grades to the studies of the school. At this meeting it was determined to hold an election in the latter part of November to vote on the question of levying a \$5000 bond issue to build an addition to the present school building, and to raise a tax for current expenses.

The school attendance has doubled since the opening of school this fall, and the present school building is not near large enough to accommodate the pupils now attending school. There are now 118 pupils enrolled, and more will be coming in shortly. The present school building, and the hall over Kendall & Chapman's store is used for school purposes, and still the facilities are not sufficient.

An addition of four rooms to the school building is an imperative necessity.

Chief of Supplies B. F. Woodman and L. R. Dewey, paymaster for the Henry & McPhee contracting firm, arrived in Redmond last week and will make this city their headquarters while construction work on the Oregon Trunk Line is under way.

In the center of Melrose Park addition to Redmond is located the only public Park within the city limits, it covers five acres.
