Whitney of Portland, superintendent of star mail routes for Oregon, was in Redmond last week, and stated that after looking over the mail service from Shaniko south he would recommend to the postal department that the through mail line from Shaniko to Prineville be changed to come around by way of Madras, instead of going to Prineville and being there made up for Redmond, Bend and other points in this section.

Mr. Whitney said he would recommond the change to take effect at an early date on account of the increasing business between Madras, Redmond and Bend also because the season for bad roads is near at hand when the present mail road via Prineville will be nearly impassable at
