Notice to Water Users

At a meeting of the Redmond City Council held on November 11th, the following rates for well water were established, rates to take effect on and after Dec. 1, 1910:

Hotels.....	\$10.00 per month
Public stables.....	10.00 "
Rooming Houses	
Under 10 rooms.....	3.00 "
10 and up to 20.....	5.00 "
Over 20 rooms.....	7.50 "
Laundries.....	5.00 "
Restaurants.....	5.00 "
Boarding Houses	
Under 5 board's.....	3.00 "
5 and up to 10.....	5.00 "
10 and up to 20.....	7.50 "
Bar rooms.....	3.00 "
Mercantile houses, 25 ft.....	1.50 "
Private houses.....	1.50 "
Families.....	1.50 "

At the present time the city is running behind more than \$150 per month in maintaining the well. The above rates for water will allow enough revenue to keep the city from running behind. This charge for water will be made for every person using water from the well, either through a private pipe line or from hydrant at the well.

Any person desiring to tap the city water mains for a private house supply must first obtain a permit from the city recorder, Wm. Phoenix. Arrangements for house pipe and fittings can be secured from Councilman H. F. Jones, who has charge of supplies.

Parties desiring to have the water mains extended, where they do not now pass their property, can make arrangements for the extension with J. G. McGuffie, city engineer.
