Whereupon the following proceedings were had: In the matter of the petition of T. W. Taylor et al for county road, board of road viewers were ordered to view, review and survey the said proposed road on the third of April, 1911 and report their findings at the next meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of George P. Elliott et al for county road, the board of road viewers were ordered to view, review and survey the said proposed road on the 5th of April, 1911, and report their findings thereon at the next meeting of this court.

In the matter of the petition of Nobles Addition to the City of Prineville; and it appearing to the court that said plat is not properly executed, it is ordered that upon the execution thereof in conformity to the statute and upon the approval by the acting engineer of the city of Prineville and by the county surveyor and the county assessor, said plat may be filed in the office of the recorder of deeds and spread of record.

In the matter of the plat of Nobles Addition to the City of Prineville; and it appearing to the court from said plat that said plat and tracing are not in conformity to law, that the same are not properly executed; it is ordered that upon the correction of said plat and tracing, and the proper execution thereof, together with the approval of the acting engineer of the City of Prineville, and the approval of the county surveyor and county assessor; said plat be accepted and ordered filed for Record.

Thereon court adjourned subject to call.
