Plenty of Water at Madras

Madras Pioneer: Water in the city well has been struck at a depth of seventy feet and is coming so fast that it will be necessary to suspend operations until a pump and engine can be installed to keep the water out of the way for the workmen to sink the shaft deeper and allow a tunnel to be run in each direction, so that a reservoir for the storage of a large quantity of water under ground may be had.

It is expected that a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes will be found inside of 15 feet further, and three crews will be placed at work as soon as the temporary plant is installed, so that in a short time the city may be able to have water for fire protection in the business district.

Prineville to Get New School

Plans have been selected for the new \$26,000 school building for Prineville and the directors will advertise for bids within a few days.

The building will be of brick, with a concrete basement, and will contain 9 class rooms with a capacity of 50 pupils each. Modern heating and ventilating systems will be installed, and the building will be up to date in every way.

There are at present almost 300 pupils enrolled, and eight rooms are in use, all of which are crowded to the limit.

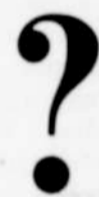
