## WHEAT LATE IN GILLIAM COUNTY

Condon, June 3.—Owing to the cold and backward weather in the county this spring grain crops in this locality are about two weeks behind the average season. While the grain is not suffering from want of moisture, in most sections of the county a hard rain at this time would be a vast benefit and this in particular applies to the north end of the county. Farmers about Condon and south of here claim they have ample moisture and are anxious to see warm weather. Fall grain is doing well and will do well if a good rain is had in June and July, which has seldom failed in this county, but spring grain which was sown late should have rain in the next ten days in order to secure a good average crop.
