J. H. Mendenhall has a trained dog that sits at a table and eats ice cream, and shows better table manners than some humans do.

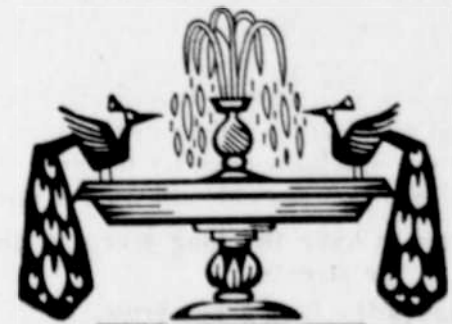
Rev. Wilson preached his farewell sermon at the M. E. church Sunday night. He does not yet know to what place he will be transferred by the Conference.
