## SIDEWALKS TO BE BUILT

City Council Orders Many Feet of New Walks to Be Laid

ANOTHER BOND CO. WANTS CITY BONDS

Saturday, Sept. 23, Named As "Clean Up" Day For the City

At the meeting of the city council Tuesday night it was ordered that sidewalks be laid on the following streets within six months:

6th street from A to H street.  
C street from 7th to 1st street.  
D street from 8th to 1st street.  
E street from 10th to 1st street.  
F street from 8th to 4th street.

A letter was received from F. Glenn & Co. of Portland, offering to take the \$27,000 issue of municipal water bonds.

Upon a request from the Commercial Club the council designated Saturday, Sept. 23d, as "Clean up" day to put the streets alleys and yards in proper condition for Railroad Day.

## REDMOND POSTOFFICE HAS BEEN ADVANCED

Will Be In the Presidential Class With an Increased Salary

The Redmond postoffice has been advanced from the fourth grade to the presidential class, and the salary increased to \$1200 per annum. By this advance the postmaster is entitled to clerk hire and office rent paid by the government. Under the fourth class the postmaster had to pay his own clerk hire and rent of building. The business of the Redmond postoffice has been rapidly increasing during the past year, until now it ranks in importance with any of the other offices in the county. With the establishing of railroad mail service here, which will be done in a short time, this office will be an important mail distributing point.

## YOUNG MAN GIVES UP 200 INCHES OF SKIN

Does This to Save Life of Sister Injured in R. R. Wreck

L. H. Baker, whose sister was badly burned in the railroad wreck on the Oregon Trunk railway some time ago, arrived here from The Dalles, where he has been in the hospital since the date of the wreck. He gave up 200 square inches of skin from his body to be grafted on the body of his sister where the skin was burned off. A like amount of skin was taken from the body of another man who was "bought" for the purpose. Mr. Baker's sister was so badly burned at the time of the wreck that for a time her life was despaired of, but at present she is doing as nicely as could be expected, and will recover her health.

Mr. Baker, who came down here to visit with his brother-in-law, Geo. W. Moore, who lives near this city, stated Monday that it was a very trying ordeal to go through to have so much skin removed from his body, and that it has taken considerable time for him to recover from the effects.
