This, despite a vicious attack by District Attorney Wilson, in which he charged that the girl had been a party to a pre-determined murder. The case went to the jury at 6 o'clock last Friday night. Early in the morning four of the jurors standing for conviction weakened and the ballot stood 10 to 2 for acquittal. Finally at 9 o'clock Saturday morning an unanimous verdict was reached at.
