

IMPROVEMENTS AT THE DEPOT

Oregon Trunk Railroad
Contemplate Number
New Buildings

WORK ON DEPOT
SOON COMMENCE

Large Freight House and
Stockyard Are to Be
Constructed

In a short time workmen will get busy at the depot and in the railroad yards here, and when they are finished the Redmond station will begin to look as if things were doing here.

Several car loads of stone for the new stone depot have arrived and it is expected the builders will arrive here from Bend, where they are building a depot, in a couple of weeks.

A freight shed 30x100 is to be built between B and C streets on the right of way, and two section houses and a residence for the depot agent will also be constructed.

A 12-car stock yard is also one of the improvements that will immediately be commenced, and in a short time it is expected the well drillers will be here to drill the big well the company intends to put down to supply the big water tank at this point.

Nearly all of the material for the railroad improvements is now on the ground, and awaiting the arrival of the workmen.

It is understood the Tum-A-Lum Lumber Co. is to build extensive coal sheds on the east side of the track, and that the Central Oregon Ice & Cold Storage Co. will soon begin the erection of a building for their plant.

In a short time the vicinity of the depot and railroad yards will take on a busy aspect, and that section of the city be built up with the necessary buildings for the expeditious conduct of the railroad company's business.

Plan to Form a C. E. Union
Here on the Above
Dates

A convention of the Christian Endeavor societies of the county will be held in Redmond Saturday and Sunday, November 25th and 26th for the purpose of forming a Christian Endeavor Union for Crook county. It is expected that a number of delegates from the different societies in the county will be here on above dates to help organize the Union, the purpose of which is to work more unitedly among young people.

At this convention officers will be elected, place secured for holding the 1912 convention, work outlined for the coming year, and other matters of business arranged.

An interesting and instructive program has been prepared which includes speeches, discussions, papers dealing with C. E. work, will be handled by competent speakers and workers. C. E. Baker, state president, is expected to be present and assist in the work.

JUNCTION POINT NOT YET DECIDED

Not Known Where
Main East and West Lines
to Join Main Line

After announcing the intention of the Harriman interests to build an east and west line at Central Oregon, providing the owners do not hold their property at figures that will prevent state from securing desirable settlers, Judge Robert S. Lee, chairman of the board of directors of all the Harriman interests who recently visited Portland predicted the dawn of a new era of relationship between people and the railroads.

The east and west line at Oregon is receiving more consideration from Mr. Lee and his associates right now at any time since the death of Mr. Harriman.

The cross-state line will meet with the Oregon Short Line at Vale on the east, and will run through Malheur Canyon, rights of way for which were secured by the Harriman interests by an agreement with the Hill roads, who had claims in that section. Lovett said that whether the road will connect with the R. & N. system at Bend, as been reported, has not been determined.
