

CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

At the meeting of the city council Tuesday night the mayor and all members were present except F. M. White, who is out of the city.

Bids for the city printing for 1911 and the year 1912 were opened, and The Redmond Spokesman having the lowest bid, the contract was, upon motion of Hosch, seconded by Huff, awarded to The Spokesman, and that paper made the official paper of the city of Redmond.

Recorder Willcox, as chairman of the auditing committee to audit the books of the city since incorporation, submitted his report, which was referred to the finance committee. The report showed that the city was nearly \$4000 in debt.

The application of Smith & Ellingham for a saloon license and transfer of the James Green license for the balance of 1911 to them, for the purpose of conducting a saloon on lot 6, block 46, original townsite, was granted.

Wells, of the street and alley committee, thought the city engineer should have charge of building bridges in the city, and a motion by Hosch carried that no bridges be accepted by the city until passed upon by the city engineer.

The question of enforcing the saloon ordinance was brought up and discussed at some length, and it was the sense of the council that the saloons be again notified to strictly comply with the regulations governing their conduct, as to opening and closing hours and gambling.

One Man Has the Bones in Right Leg Badly Splintered

Sunday afternoon, while Mr. Camp, foreman of the carpenter crew working on the railroad buildings here, and Adolph Jacobson, one of his employes, were coming to this place from Hillman on a railroad speeder the machine jumped the track at the switch at the latter place and Jacobson was thrown between the main track and the switch. His right leg was broken, the bones being badly splintered, and he was otherwise bruised. Mr. Camp was bruised about the face and body. Jacobson was brought to this city and taken to the Oregon Hotel where Dr. Hosch attended him, and at present the patient is getting along as nicely as could be expected.
