ORDINANCE NO. 19

An ordinance to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the city of Redmond, Oregon, and upon the credit thereof, by issuing the negotiable coupon bonds of the city in the aggregate amount of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.00), for the purpose of acquiring waterworks for fire and domestic purposes, prescribing the form of said bonds, and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the principal thereof and the interest thereon.

Whereas, under the provisions of the charter of the city of Redmond, Oregon, the common council is authorized to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the city and upon the credit thereof by issuing the negotiable coupon bonds of the city, for the purpose of acquiring waterworks for fire and domestic purposes, in an amount not exceeding the aggregate amount of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.00); and,

Whereas, the common council of said city of Redmond has found and does hereby find and declare that the health and safety of the city of Redmond and the inhabitants thereof demand the immediate construction of a system of waterworks for fire and domestic purposes, the same to be owned and operated by the city; and,

Whereas, the city of Redmond does not have and will not have adequate and sufficient funds with which to pay for the construction and installation of such system of waterworks, and therefore has found and does hereby find and declare that it is necessary for the city to issue its negotiable coupon bonds in the aggregate amount of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.00), for the purpose of acquiring such system of waterworks;

Now therefore, be it ordained by the common council of the city of Redmond:

Section 1. That a system of waterworks for fire and domestic purposes be constructed and acquired by the common council of the city of Redmond, of such capacity, extent and magnitude as to said council may seem necessary for the needs of the inhabitants of said city, said system to be owned, managed and operated by the city.

Section 2. That suitable and necessary ground, rights of way, water, water rights, machinery and appliances be acquired by said city by purchase, donation, condemnation or otherwise, for the proper construction, operation and maintenance of the said system of waterworks.

Section 3. That there be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the city in the aggregate amount of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.00), for the purpose of acquiring waterworks for fire and domestic purposes; said bonds to bear date the first day of November, A. D. 1911, and to mature as follows:

- Two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) eleven (11) years after date;
- Two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) twelve (12) years after date;
- Two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) thirteen (13) years after date;
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) fourteen (14) years after date;
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) fifteen (15) years after date;
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) sixteen (16) years after date;
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) seventeen (17) years after date;
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) eighteen (18) years after date;
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) nineteen (19) years after date; and
- Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) twenty (20) years after date;

Said bonds to consist of twenty-

seven (27) bonds in the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) each, numbered consecutively from one (1) to twenty-seven (27), both numbers inclusive, and to be payable as aforesaid in the order of their number, to-wit:

Bonds numbered one (1) and two (2), eleven (11) years after date;

Bonds numbered three (3) and four (4), twelve (12) years after date;

Bonds numbered five (5) and six (6), thirteen (13) years after date;

Bonds numbered seven (7), and eight (8) and nine (9), fourteen (14) years after date;

Bonds numbered ten (10), eleven (11) and twelve (12), fifteen (15) years after date;

Bonds numbered thirteen (13), fourteen (14) and fifteen (15), sixteen (16) years after date;

Bonds numbered sixteen (16), seventeen (17) and eighteen (18), seventeen (17) years after date;

Bonds numbered nineteen (19), twenty (20) and twenty-one (21), eighteen (18) years after date;

Bonds numbered twenty-two (22), twenty-three (23) and twenty-four (24), nineteen (19) years after date; and,

Bonds numbered twenty-five (25), twenty-six (26) and twenty-seven (27), twenty (20) years after date;

Both the principal and interest to be payable at the office of the city treasurer in Redmond, Oregon, or at the banking house of Kountze Brothers, in the city of New York, U. S. A., at the option of the holder. Said bonds to bear interest at the rate of seven per centum (7 per cent) per annum, semi-annually on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, and said interest to be represented by semi-annual interest coupons attached to each of said bonds, each coupon representing a half yearly payment of the interest on the bond to which it is attached; said bonds to be signed by the mayor, attested by the recorder, and countersigned by the treasurer, and to bear the seal of the city, and the coupons thereto attached to bear the original or engraved fac-simile signature of the city treasurer.

Section 4. That the said bonds and coupons be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

The city of Redmond, in the county of Crook and state of Oregon, for value received, hereby acknowledges itself to be indebted and hereby promises to pay to bearer the sum of one thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States of America, on the first day of November, A. D., 19... with interest thereon at the rate of seven per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, upon the presentation and surrender of this bond and the annexed coupons as they severally become due, both principal and interest being payable at the office of the city treasurer in Redmond, Oregon, or at the banking house of Kountze Brothers, in the city of New York, U. S. A., at the option of the holder.

This bond is issued for the purpose of acquiring waterworks for fire and domestic purposes by virtue of and in full conformity with the constitution and laws of the state of Oregon, the charter of the city of Redmond, and an ordinance of said city, duly adopted and made a law thereof prior to the issue of this bond, and it is hereby certified that all requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers of said city in the issuing of this bond, and that the total debt of said city, including
