These Three Men Elected Councilmen For Three Years

At the city election held here Monday for the councilmen to take the place of F. W. McCaffery, G. M. Huffman and J. F. Hosch, whose term of office expires this month, J. F. Hosch, Roy A. Bush and W. H. Anderson were elected on the Citizens Ticket to serve as councilmen for the term of two years. Following is the vote cast:

Messrs. Buckley and Hobbs had been nominated on the Independent Ticket, but Hobbs withdrew before his name was printed on the ticket. The councilmen elect are well known citizens of Redmond, are good business men, and the vote given them testifies that the voters of the city have confidence in their ability to serve the city well.

His reign lasted only a year, and his successor, Pertinax, sold his belongings at auction, and one of the lots, we are told, was a carriage which as it moved marked at the same time the space covered and the time so occupied.—London Globe.
