





Commodus came to an untimely if not unmerited end about 102 A. D. He posed as Hercules and was the hero of about 700 gladiatorial contests with defenseless opponents. His reign lasted only a year, and his successor, Pertinax, sold his belongings at auction, and one of the lots, we are told, was a carriage which as it moved marked at the same time the space covered and the time so occupied .-- London Globe.
