

OCCUPATION TAX WINS IN RECORDERS COURT

Jury Finds E. L. Rapp Guilty of Not Conforming to Provisions of Ordinance Number Four

E. L. Rapp, clothing merchant of this city who is closing out his stock of goods, was arrested Monday on a warrant issued by Recorder Wilcox, charging him with doing business contrary to ordinance No. 4 of the city. The complaint stated Mr. Rapp had refused to pay an occupation tax as provided for in the ordinance.

Mr. Rapp demanded a jury trial and the case was heard yesterday afternoon before Recorder Wilcox, and a jury of six. Mayor Jones appeared for the city, and Attorney McFarlane represented Mr. Rapp. The jury found the defendant guilty as charged in the complaint, viz: Conducting a clothing store without paying the occupation tax prescribed by ordinance. The fine was \$10.

The finding of the jury does not establish the legality of the ordinance in question.

It is understood that Mr. Rapp will appeal the case.
