AROUND THE COUNTY

Brief News of the Various Happenings

Nearly 1000 rabbits were killed in a rabbit drive near Culver a few days ago, and another drive will be made in a short time to try and kill off a lot more of the pests.

The farmers around Culver have formed an organization for the purpose of bettering themselves in the science of growing potatoes on dry soil. It is the intention to grow but one variety of potato, and do that right and successfully.

Sixty thousand pounds of potatoes for seed have been ordered by the Culver people.

The Terrebonne school district has voted \$4,000 bonds for a new school house.

Primeville has secured a good natural reservoir site for city water. There is a 200 foot fall, and a good fire pressure will be obtained. The site is 16 miles from the city, on Marx creek.

The city council at Madras has licensed the pool halls there, but prohibits minors from playing in them.

Madras has purchased a hose cart and sufficient hose for fire protection of the city.

The water system at Madras is completed, and the citizens are rejoicing over the event.

Five cars of cattle were recently shipped from Terrebonne that brought the top price in the Portland market.

A good quality of clay has been found near Terrebonne, and steps are being taken to start a brick yard there.

The Ladies Pioneer Club at Terrebonne recently held a social and cleared \$33.50.

Metolius is to have a large general store, to be operated by the Central Oregon Mercantile Co. The building will be 50x50 feet.

A postal savings bank is to be opened at Bend on the 27th.

The stone depot of the Oregon Trunk railroad at Bend is nearly ready for the officials to occupy.

The Bend city council has sent a petition to the post office department asking for free carrier mail delivery in the city. Under a new ruling cities of 1999 population or over are entitled to a carrier system, and as Bend claims 1999 population they want Uncle Sam to hire a man to bring around the mail to their doors.

The curfew bell at Bend is rung every night at 8 o'clock, and the police see that the youngsters are off the streets after that hour.

Some of the towns along the Oregon Trunk railroad are urging the road to put on another passenger train—one that will make the run from this section of the state to Portland during the night so as to arrive there in the morning instead of in the evening.

GARDEN SEEDS FOR DISTRIBUTION, FREE

The Spokesman has received two mail sacks of garden seeds from the government, through Senator Bourne, for distribution among the people of this section. Those who desire any of these seeds are requested to call at this office and their wants will be filled. There are beans, lettuce, parsley, radish and tomato seeds. It will be a good plan to come early before the supply is exhausted. The seeds are free.
