TO ESTABLISH FIRE LIMITS

Ordinance Prohibiting Construction of Frame Buildings Within Certain Limits of City.

of the city council last Thursday night ordinance No. 24 was introduced and read for the first time. This ordinance establishes a fire limit in the city, and restricts the kind of buildings to be built within that district. The limits are from C street to F street on Sixth street to the alieys between Fifth and Sixth and Sixth and Seventh streets.

The ordinance prescribes the kind of buildings that will have to be constructed within this area, and also restricts the addition to buildings already built, and repairs to same. After the ordinance goes into effect no building except constructed of stone, bricks or concrete will be allowed erected within the above lim-

All of the councilmen are in favor of the above ordinance and there is no question but what the same will be passed. With the above restrictions it will be only a short time before Redmond will become a well built city of stone or brick buildings. The use of native stone has demon-strated that that class of building can be put up here at a slight cost over frame structures, and thereby materially afford good fire protec-

Denver Bond Firm Willing to Accept \$40,000 of Water Bonds of City for Putting in a System From the Deschutes River.

It now begins to look as if Red-mond would have a modern water system in a short time. Causey & Co., the Denver bond firm that ac-cepted the \$27,000 bond issue voted some time ago by the city for con struction of a water works plant, have signified their willingness to take bonds of the city up to \$40,000 By change in the plans of the water works it was found the cost of constructing the plant would ex-ceed the \$27,000 voted for the pur-pose, and the Portland contracting firm who had bid on the contract got in touch with the Denver firm. with the result mentioned above
