ORDINANCE No. 24

An Ordinance Providing for the Prevention of Fires.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Redmond, Oregon.

Section 1. That the fire limits of the city are hereby defined and established as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the west line of the alley between Fifth and Sixth streets with the north line of F street, thence west along the north line of F street to the intersection of said north line of F street with the east line of the alley between Sixth and Seventh streets, thence north along the east line of said alley to the intersection of said east line of said alley with the south line of C street, thence east along the south line of C street to the intersection of said south line of C street with the west line of the alley between Fifth and Sixth streets, thence south along the west line of said alley to place of beginning.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to build, construct or place, by removal or otherwise, within the fire limits as defined in Section One of this ordinance, any building, or part of or addition to any building or structure, unless the outer walls of such building or structure, or part of or addition to such building or structure, be of brick, stone, cement or some other non-combustible material, with fire proof roof; provided, that the Council may, by a two-thirds vote of all the members thereof, authorize the improvement, alteration and repair of, and the building of additions to, any building, erection or structure, located and standing within the said fire limits at the time of the taking effect of this ordinance; and provided further, that the outer walls of all buildings or structures hereinafter erected within such limits if constructed of any other material than reinforced cement shall be at least twelve inches thick and if constructed of reinforced cement then at least eight inches thick. And it shall also be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to remove any building, structure, or part or addition thereof from one part of said fire limits to another part therein, unless the same be constructed in accordance with the requirements of this section in respect to the outer walls thereof.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to construct, build, erect, or cause to be built, constructed, erected or

set up, within the fire limits as defined in Section One of this ordinance, any flue, stove pipe, stove, furnace, fire place, oven or hearth, or any apparatus for heating purposes, except where oil is used, unless the same be conducted or made into an open chimney with walls not less than four inches in thickness, constructed of well burned brick, or of stone or cement, with the flue thereof lined with a layer of plaster which shall securely close all openings between the brick or stone, or layers of cement. And such chimney must project at least two feet above the ridge of the roof through which it is built, or, when built through the sides of the roof, the top or external flue of said chimney must be at least four feet from the nearest part of the roof or any part of any building.

Section 4. No stove pipe shall be suffered to pass through any wall, partition, or floor of any building within the fire limits as defined in Section One of this ordinance, unless such pipe shall be at least three inches from any surrounding or adjoining wood or combustible material, and shall be surrounded through such passage by a perforated thimble or ventilator made of some metallic or non-combustible substance; and no stove pipe or metallic flue shall be projected through any roof or external wall of any building; nor through more than one floor or internal wall or partition. And no chimney flues or openings for the entrance of stove pipes shall be in any unused attic or garret of any house, building or structure.

Section 5. Any flues, chimneys, pipes, stacks, thimbles, or heating apparatus whatever, which, at the time of the adoption of this ordinance, may be out of repair, or which does not conform with the requirements hereof, or which may be considered by the City Council as inviting danger by fire, shall be brought into conformity herewith, and the Common Council may, by resolution, fix the time within which the provisions of this ordinance in respect to existing defects as herein defined must be complied with; and any person disregarding any orders issued, or resolution adopted under this ordinance shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter imposed.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the marshal to see that the provisions of this ordinance are strictly enforced, and to report any violation of the same promptly to the mayor.
