TAMPERED WITH LINOTYPE

Monday night, August 12th, some person or persons broke into The Spokesman office and tampered with the Linotype—the machine with which the type for The Spokesman is set.

An expert machinist has been sent for and it is expected the machine will be running in a day or two.

Ordinance No. 29

An ordinance to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the city of Redmond, Oregon, and upon the credit thereof, by issuing the negotiable coupon bonds of the city in the aggregate amount of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000), for the purpose of acquiring waterworks for fire and domestic purposes, prescribing the form of said bonds, and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the principal thereof and the interest thereon.

Whereas, under the provisions of the charter of the city of Redmond, Oregon, the common council is authorized to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the city and upon the credit thereof by issuing the negotiable bonds of the city, for the purpose of acquiring water works for

fire and domestic purposes, in an amount not exceeding the aggregate amount of thirty five thousand dollars (\$35,000); and

Whereas, the common council of said city of Redmond has found and does hereby find and declare that the health and safety of the city of Redmond and the inhabitants thereof demand the immediate construction of a system of water works for fire and domestic purposes, the same to be owned and operated by the city, and

Whereas, the city of Redmond does not have and will not receive from the proceeds of the issue of bonds aggregating twenty seven thousand dollars (\$27,000), authorized November 7th, 1911, adequate and sufficient funds with which to pay for the construction or installation of such system of water works, and therefore has found and does hereby find and declare that it is necessary for the city to issue its negotiable coupon water bonds in the additional aggregate amount of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) for the purpose of acquiring such system of water works.

Now therefore be it ordained by the common council of the city of Redmond:

Section 1. That a system of water works for fire and domestic purposes be constructed and acquired by the common council of the city of Redmond, of such capacity, extent and magnitude as to said council may seem necessary for the needs of the inhabitants of said city, said system to be owned, managed and operated by the city.

Section 2. That suitable and necessary ground, rights of way, water, water rights, machinery and appliances, be acquired by said city by purchase, donation, condemnation or otherwise, for the proper construction, operation and maintenance of the said system of water works.

Section 3. That there be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the

city in the aggregate amount of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000), for the purpose of acquiring waterworks for fire and domestic purposes, said bonds to bear date the first day of August, A. D. 1912, and to mature as follows:

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) ten (10) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) eleven (11) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) twelve (12) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) thirteen (13) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) fourteen (14) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) fifteen (15) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) sixteen (16) years after date;

One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) seventeen (17) years after date.

Said bonds to consist of eight (8) bonds in the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) each, numbered consecutively from one (1) to eight (8), both numbers inclusive, and to be payable as aforesaid in the order of their number, to wit:

Bond numbered one (1), ten (10) years after date;

Bond numbered two (2), eleven (11) years after date;

Bond numbered three (3), twelve (12) years after date;

Bond numbered four (4), thirteen (13) years after date;

Bond numbered five (5), fourteen (14) years after date;

Bond numbered six (6), fifteen (15) years after date;

Bond numbered seven (7), sixteen (16) years after date;

Bond numbered eight (8), seventeen (17) years after date;

Both the principal and interest to be payable at the office of the city treasurer in Redmond, Oregon, or at the National Park Bank, the fiscal agency of the state of Oregon, in the city of New York, U. S. A., or in the event of the discontinuance of such

Fiscal Agency, then at the banking house of Kountze Brothers in said City and State of New York, at the option of the holder. Said bonds to bear interest at the rate of seven per centum (7 per centum) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of February and the first day of August in each year, and said interest to be represented by semi-annual interest coupons attached to each of said bonds, each coupon representing a half yearly payment of the interest on the bond to which it is attached; said bonds to be signed by the mayor, attested by the recorder, and countersigned by the treasurer, and to bear the seal of the city and the coupons thereto attached to bear the original or engraved fac-simile signature of the city treasurer.


Section 4. That the said bonds and coupons be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

The city of Redmond, in the county of Crook and State of Oregon, for value received, hereby acknowledges itself to be indebted and hereby promises to pay to bearer the sum of one thousand dollars in lawful money of the United States of America, on the first day of August, A. D. 19..... with interest thereon at the rate of seven per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of February and the first day of August in each year, upon the presentation and surrender of this bond and the annexed coupons as they severally become due, both principal and interest being payable at the office of the city treasurer in Redmond, Oregon, or at the National Park Bank, the fiscal agency of the State of Oregon, in the city of New York, U. S. A., or in the event of the discontinuance of such fiscal agency, then at the banking house of

This bond is issued for the purpose of acquiring water works for fire and domestic purposes by virtue of and in full conformity with the constitution and laws of the State of Oregon, the charter of the city of Redmond, and an ordinance of said city, duly adopted and made a law thereof prior to the issue of this bond, and it is hereby certified that all requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers of said city in the issuing of this bond, and that the total debt of said city, including that of this bond does not exceed any limit of indebtedness prescribed by the constitution or laws of the State of Oregon, or the charter and ordinances of the city of Redmond, and that provision has been made in full conformity with law for the levy and collection of an annual tax sufficient to pay the interest on this bond and also the principal thereof as they become due.

The faith and credit of the city of Redmond are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this bond.

In testimony whereof the common council of the city of Redmond has caused this bond to be signed by the mayor of said city, attested by the recorder thereof, and countersigned by the city treasurer, and the seal of said city affixed, as of the first day of August, A. D. 1912.

On the day of A. D. 19..... the city of Redmond, in the State of Oregon, will pay to the bearer thirty-five dollars in lawful money of the United States of America, at the office of the city treasurer in Redmond, Oregon, or at the National Park Bank, the fiscal agency of the State of Oregon, in the city of New York, U. S. A., or in the event of the discontinuance of such Fiscal Agency, then at the banking house of Kountze Brothers in said city and State of New York, at the option of the holder, being interest then due on its negotiable coupon bond dated August 1, 1912.

Section 5. That said bonds when issued, be disposed of by the common council of said city according to law and the charter of said city, and the funds raised thereby applied solely for the purpose for which said bonds are issued, but the purchaser or purchasers of said bonds shall not in any manner be responsible for the application or disposal by

said city or any of its officers or employees of any of the funds derived from the sale thereof.

Section 6. When the city shall have completed the construction of such water works, that the same be operated and managed by the city, and all water taxes, rates, and rents for water furnished and used therefrom, be directly collected by the city in such manner as shall be provided by ordinance or resolution, and the proceeds of said taxes, rates and rents, together with all income therefrom, including the plumbing and tapping of mains and laying and connecting supply pipes thereto, be used to defray the running expenses of such water works and to keep the same in repair; and the balance of said income from said water works shall constitute a fund to pay the principal and interest of said bonds; and after the construction of said water works, the tapping of mains thereof for the purpose of attaching supply pipes thereto, and the laying of such supply pipes, digging of trenches therefor from the mains to the sidewalk and placing stops there-in whenever the same shall be required, shall be done only by the employees of the city engaged for that purpose, and the proceeds thereof shall be treated as income from said water works and devoted to the interest and redemption funds as hereinbefore provided; and no contract shall be made with or permission given to, any person, company or corporation to tap said mains or lay said supply pipes, or to run or operate said water works otherwise than as herein provided.

Section 7. That the interest falling due on said bonds on the first day of February, A. D. 1913, and on the first day of August, A. D. 1913, shall be paid out of the general fund of said city, and for the purpose of reimbursing said general fund for said two semi-annual installments of interest and to meet the interest accruing on said bonds on the first day of February and the first day of August, A. D. 1914, there shall be levied in the year 1912 on all the taxable property in said city, in addition to all other taxes, a direct annual tax sufficient to produce the sum of one thousand, one hundred and twenty (\$1,120) dollars, that in order to raise the necessary funds with which to pay the interest due February 1, 1915, and thereafter, up to and including August 1, 1921, promptly and as the same accrues, there shall be levied in each of the years 1913 to 1919 inclusive, on all the taxable property in said city, in addition to all other taxes, a direct annual tax sufficient to produce the sum of five hundred and sixty dollars (\$560), for the purpose of paying two installments of said interest; that in order to raise the necessary funds with which to pay the interest due February 1 and August 1, 1922, promptly and as the same accrues, and to create a sinking fund for the
