

Certain citizens of Bend, some of whom supported Judge Ellis for renomination at a Primary, have recently brought forward Dr. Coe of that place, as a so-called non-partisan can date. Without argument I leave it to your intelligence to determine the object of the candidate of the ex-mayor of Bend for the office of County Judge. Who is furnishing the funds for " spectacular display, the banners and placards in public places and the brass band campaign Dr. Coe, and why?

The County Judge is the Judge of Probate and of the Juvenile Court. His court has co current jurisdiction in all actions where the subject in controversy does not exceed in value sum of \$500. He is required to issue writs of habeas corpus and of injunction on proper app cation. It is only when county business is being transacted that the County Judge and the " commissioners comprise the County Court. If your County Judge is not himself an attended he must act on the advice of counsel. I leave it for you to determine whether your interests best safe guarded with a farmer, a doctor, or a lawyer as County Judge.

I believe in the popular slogan of good roads, in the construction of roads in the new sections of the county, and the improvement of roads in the older settled localities, for the best fit of the farmer, the rancher, and the towns. I believe, however, that we should first make p vision to pay for them. Vote for your choice of the pending County Bonding bills and let the who come after us help to bear the expense of permanent improvements. Crook County is much in need of a little plain and simple finance for the next four years in order to liquidate the preent overdraft that has been made on county funds.

You will not have another chance to vote for a County Judge for four years. Dur that time we await and expect a great development in Central Oregon, and particularly Crook County. Under the circumstances you should consider well the situation before casting your ballot for any man for this office, and then vote for what you deem to be the best interest of Crook County and of yourself and family.
